Principal activities

The principal activity of the company is to acquire sales agency rights in feature films and to then market and sell them to distributors around the world on behalf of the films producers. The company began to earn commission income in July 2012.

During the year the company held the acquired sales agency rights in one film

For accounting purposes the cost of the agency rights, together with marketing and sales expenses, are shown in debtors. As sales commissions are earned from the sales of the films the relevant proportion of the debtor balance is taken to cost of sales.

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

12 Turnover

Turnover represents commission earned on the proceeds of the sale of film rights, exclusive of VAT

1.3 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

1.4 Foreign currencies
