Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Elgin Energy Es Co Limited (the 'Company') for the year ended 31 March 2020, which comprise the Balance Sheet and the related notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

1. General information

Elgin Energy Es Co Limited (07176403) is incorporated in England and Wales and limited by shares. The principal activity of the company is to provide development and management services to the sites (SPVs) held in fellow subsidiaries. The address of the registered office is given in the company information page of these financial statements.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Revenue

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of cost incurred on behalf of it's fellow subsidiaries and management services supplied during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

2.3 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Office equipment

- 25% straight line

The assets' residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively if appropriate, or if there is an indication of a significant change since the last reporting date.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised in profit or loss.

2.4 Valuation of investments

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

2.5 Stocks

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs.

2.6 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.7 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours.

2.8 Financial instruments

The Company only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties and investments in ordinary shares.

For financial assets measured at cost less impairment, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and best estimate of the recoverable amount, which is an approximation of the amount that the Company would receive for the asset if it were to be sold at the balance sheet date.

2.9 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price.

2.10 Foreign currency translation

Functional and presentation currency

The Company's functional and presentational currency is GBP.

Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate. Non-monetary items measured at historical cost are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items measured at fair value are measured using the exchange rate when fair value was determined.

2.11 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to profit or loss over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

2.12 Taxation

Tax is recognised in profit or loss except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

3. Employees

The average monthly number of employees, including directors, during the year was 12 (2019 - 7).

12. Reserves

Profit and loss account

The profit and loss account represents profit and losses net of adjustments.

13. Related party transactions

During the year, the company repaid a loan totalling £99,883 to a company controlled by a director. No interest has been charged on the loan, which was repayable on demand. At the year end, £nil (2019 - £99,883) is included within other creditors due within one year.

The company has a loan totalling £200,000 from a company controlled by a director. No interest has been charged on the loan, which is repayable on demand. At the year end, £200,000 (2019 - £200,000) is included within other creditors due within one year.

During the year, the company received a loan totalling £726,000 from a company controlled by a director. A repayment of £550,000 was made by the company toward this loan. Interest of £17,800 (2019 - £2,299) has been charged on the loan, which is repayable on demand. At the year end, £471,099 (2019 - £277,299) is included within other creditors due after more than one year.

The company is a parent to its wholly owned subsidiary and accordingly has taken the exemptions provided within paragraph 33.1A of FRS 102 and therefore transactions with group companies have not been disclosed.

14. Controlling party

The company's parent undertaking is Elgin Energy Holdings Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales.

There is no ultimate controlling party.
