The company has invested in online and social media solutions to create and develop the Livsmarter brand. The company has also developed a complimentary range of products to support the brand. The Directors anticipate that the offering will begin to experience significant activity in the second half of this financial year. The brand has potential to expand way beyond its initial target market and has been designed with international conversions in mind.

Touch4 Limited is a related party by virtue of being a fellow subsidiary in the group headed up by Moloney Technologies Limited During the year wages and salaries were paid by Touch4 Limited on behalf of the company which have been recharged as a management fee. At the year end the balance outstanding was £nil (2012 £nil)

Enterprise Technologies (UK) Limited is a related party by virtue of being a fellow subsidiary in the group headed up by Moloney Technologies Limited. At the year end the balance outstanding was £nil (2012 £10,000)

13. Ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party

The immediate parent company and ultimate controlling related party is Moloney Technologies Limited by virtue of its 90% ownership of the company's ordinary share capital

14. Liability limitation agreement with auditor

The proportionate hability agreement follows the terms in Appendix B to the Financial Reporting Council's June 2008 Guidance on Audit Liability Agreements, and was approved by the Shareholders by written resolution.
