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### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006 present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

Our trust's purpose, as set out in the objects contained in the company's Memorandum of Association, are to:

"advance for the public benefit education in the United Kingdom, in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing by promoting the establishment, maintenance, carrying on, management and development of Knowledge Schools Trust"

The aims and objectives of our trust are to support the schools and pupils in the Knowledge Schools Trust.

#### **Public benefit**

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

#### **Charitable activities**

The trust continues to attract regular standing order donations, one-off donations and other donations at events and via ParentPay. These donations are used to support the aims of the trust. This year the Trust also received two large donations from Johnnie Boden and Julian Granville for the purpose of running three programmes.

For all the schools (the secondary, the sixth form and the three primary schools) the Foundation Trust raised the majority of unrestricted funds from standing orders with additional funds raised from one-off donations, ParentPay donations and collections at school concerts and other events. The Foundation Trust was able to claim £38,719 in Gift Aid.

All the funds raised for individual schools are restricted for use in the school for which they are raised. Funding for the secondary and sixth form amounted to £132,000 and for the primaries £33,000. We remain optimistic that the funding will continue to grow in the future.

The Trust made a number of grants during the year. The Largest percentage of grants went on funding the secondary's extra-curricular programme. The programme allows students to pick from activities in the following areas:

Additionally, for the secondary and sixth form the Foundation Trust provided grants to support group university visits and career advice. The Trust also funded music programmes, including choral skills and the Christmas concert.

The Foundation Trust also made grants to the primary schools including a grant for refurbishment of the Multi-Use Games Area and a grant for musical instruments.

### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities

The Boden-Granville donations were provided to fund three distinct programmes: two projects at the secondary and one at the primary schools.

The first of the secondary projects is a three-year commitment to deliver The West London Free School 'World of Work' programme, which is designed to improve the quality of careers advice throughout the school, with a focus on disadvantaged students. The programme includes:

- Teaching soft skills
- Psychometric testing
- Work experience
- One-to-one career guidance interviews

The first year of the programme has proved successful.

The second of the secondary projects is a programme to provide extra help for the school's under-performing students in an attempt to improve their GCSE grades in English and maths. Good progress has been made by a number of the students since the programme was put in place.

The third project, which just involves the primary schools, is the Curriculum Project. This is an ongoing effort to develop and share the curriculum resources and expertise the primary schools have developed over the course of their lives. In particular, the Trust's primaries have developed extensive, knowledge-based materials in Science, History, Geography and Art. The Project has progressed well, with dozens of schools across England now using the primaries' resources, and exceeded expectations.

The Foundation Trust is grateful to Johnnie Boden and Julian Granville for making the donations to make these programs possible.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### **Reserves policy**

Total reserves held by the Trust at year-end were £296,332 (2018 £90,806). £146,270 (2018 £7,480) was held in restricted funds and £150,062 (2018 £83,326) in unrestricted funds. The trustees have examined the Trust's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation and consider the reserves to be more than adequate. Free reserves at the year-end amounted to £150,062 (2018 £83,326).

The results for the period are set out on Page 7 and show that the Trust's income was £376,028 (2018 £135,921) and expenditure on charitable activities was £170,502 (2018 £132,538). The charity made a surplus for the year of £205,526 (2018 deficit £3,383).

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

During 2019-2020 the Trust plans to carry on raising funds for the schools with a view to enhancing the education of the pupils, primarily through the collection of voluntary donations from parents and supporters of the school. The Trust also plans to continue raising funds from outside donors and foundations. Funds raised will be used to make grants to support the education of the pupils.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a company limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The Knowledge Schools Foundation Trust is a registered charity (no. 1138194) and registered company (no. 07292254). The governing document of the charity is its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 20 May 2010. The charity was incorporated on 22 June 2010 as a company limited by guarantee and with no share capital. It was registered with the Charity Commission of England and Wales on 28 September 2010. The company changed its name from the West London Free School Foundation Trust to Knowledge Schools Foundation Trust on the 24 July 2017, which was registered with the Charities Commission on the 27 July 2017. The members of the company are the trustees. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per subscriber of the company.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purpose of charity law. New trustees may be appointed by the Trust by ordinary resolution. All trustees may be reappointed at their rotation date at the AGM. All trustees are Members. The trustees of the Trust are elected to serve for a period of four years. Trustees retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits from the Trust.

#### Induction and training of new trustees

Five of the current trustees are familiar with the Trust, having been involved with it for at least two years, and two have been involved since its inception. Three of the trustees were involved in founding the Academy Trust and the first of the four schools. New trustees have been provided with all the relevant Trust documents and policies. They have been provided with an induction session with the Chairman to learn about all the activities of the Trust. In addition, they have been provided with materials on the function of charities.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity and is rounded to the nearest pound.

#### Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by a donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

#### **Debtors**

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

#### **Creditors**

Creditors are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are recognised at their settlement amount.

#### Limited by guarantee

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. In the event of the company being wound up the liability of the members is limited to £10.
