#### Notes to the Financial Statements

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the period and the preceding period.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards. The director believes that that the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully. The company is dependent for its working capital on funding provided by Smart Solutions (Recruitment) Limited, its ultimate parent undertaking. Smart Solutions (Recruitment) Limited has indicated that for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the company and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. This should enable the company to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment.

As with any company placing reliance on other group entities for financial support, the director acknowledges that there can be no certainty that this support will continue although at the date of approval of these financial statements, they have no reason to believe that it will not do so. Thus the company continues to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual financial statements.

As the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Smart Solutions (Recruitment) Limited, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with other wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group.

#### Turnover

Turnover represents amounts (excluding value added tax) derived from the provision of services to customers. Revenue on training courses is recognised over the period of the course.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset, less its estimated residual value, over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Plant and machinery

20% on cost

#### **Taxation**

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis.

## Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

## Hire purchase and leasing commitments (continued)

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability. Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Further reductions to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) and to 18% (effective 1 April 2020) were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015, and an additional reduction to 17% (effective from 1 April 2020) was announced in the Budget on 16 March 2016. This will reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly.
