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Trustees' Report For the year ended 31 March 2019

The Trustees of Space 2 Be Me Ltd present their report as Trustees and Directors together with the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019. The Trustees confirm that the Annual Report and financial statements of the company comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the company's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) as amended by Update Bulletin 1 (effective 1 January 2015).

Since the company qualifies as small under section 383, the strategic report required of medium and large companies under The Companies Act 2006 (Strategic Report and Director's Report) Regulations 2013 is not required.

Objectives and activities

Space 2 Be Me Ltd's object as set out in its Articles of Association is to provide or otherwise support the provision of services for disabled and special needs children and young people and their family members where the child is on the roll of a school and/or lives in Maidstone or the surrounding areas and is up to and including 25 years of age.

Strategic vision

Space 2 Be Me Ltd's strategic vision is to support disabled children and young people and those with special needs to have the same life opportunities as their non-disabled peers, both educationally and socially and for their parents and families to feel supported, empowered and valued. This is achieved through 4 key objectives:

- Providing comprehensive information, advice and signposting to ensure families can make informed choices and access services that meet their needs.
- Offering a range of formal and informal support and social opportunities for parents and disabled children and young people.
- Working to ensure future services are parent driven and responsive to the needs of families and disabled children and young people by speaking up for what families tell us they need and representing them to key partners.
- Working to ensure that disabled children are able to access universal provision where desired in a safe and supported manner and in doing so feel included and valued.

This year the Trustees and staff of Space 2 Be Me Ltd examined work undertaken in the 2 year strategy and business plan which came to an end in March 2018 and began to identify priorities and ideas moving forward. A workshop with staff and trustees in September 2018 was the start of developing a new phase for Space 2 Be Me.

Priorities identified for the year ended March 2019 included:

- Continuing to deliver our core offer of family events, support groups and provision of information to families
- Ensuring the continuation of our clubs offering to ensure there is a club in place for every age group up to age 25
- Looking after our members better and developing our membership offering as well as strengthening awareness of Space 2 Be Me in Tunbridge Wells and Tonbridge and Malling
- Offering a Family Support service in Maidstone and West Kent including regular drop ins, coffee mornings and one to one support where required.
- Delivering training and for parents of children with additional needs including the Cygnet programme
- Winding down the Independent Support programme delivered with our Consortium partners until it came to an end in the summer of 2018
- · Enhancing online presence via improvements to the website and social media; developing our marketing capabilities
- Broadening and diversifying our funding base, to include more grant funding, donations from individuals, community fundraising and corporate partners.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The objectives of the charitable company are the support and provision of services for disabled and special needs children. The level of public benefit is demonstrated by the support provided.

Volunteers

Over the 2018-19 financial year the organisation has benefitted from the input of a number of volunteers, in addition to that of the Trustees (who also act as volunteers). The input of all volunteers is highly valued, and this year we have continued to benefit from the support of young volunteers who have helped us both in the office and in our clubs.

We have begun to work on a volunteer strategy, in particular developing the input from service users who are available and want to become more involved, and plan to develop this area in the near future.

Achievements and Performance

Review of activities

Delivery of core offer: Our work with other parent-led charities in the Consortium Totius has continued, largely focused on the consistent core offer across Kent of family events and support groups for parents of disabled children up to age of 18. This funding has decreased over the years, but KCC provided us with a two-year strategic grant agreement last year to deliver family events and support groups: this was due to come to an end on March 2020 but has now been extended for one further year. Space 2 Be Me Ltd receives funding to deliver this work across West Kent. We exceeded our targets with 10 family events and 63 family support sessions and support groups. Family activities this year included the ever-popular Adventure Kidz exclusive soft play sessions, bowling sessions, a boat trip, a family day at Kent Life and exclusive hire of the Polar Adventure at Maidstone Leisure Centre. Our family activities continue to be very popular with a total of 816 attendees at our events throughout the year.

Maintaining and developing our clubs offer: This year has been one of consolidation following a period of rapid development and expansion. Space 2 Be Me clubs had previously increased rapidly in both number of clubs available as well as attendance both in Maidstone and in Tonbridge we introduced a new club for younger children called Starships. This meant we are offering opportunities for children with additional needs from birth to 25 in both locations. Most clubs run on a monthly basis, although a couple in Tonbridge for older children are running monthly but we feel it would be good to increase this capacity in the near future.

Current club offerings are:

- Dance Stars in Maidstone (two weekly sessions, all ages)
- Rockets Maidstone (for children aged 6-10 and siblings)
- Comets Maidstone (for 10-12s)
- Galaxy Maidstone (for 13-17s)
- Universe Maidstone and Universe Tonbridge (for 18-25s)
- Starships Tonbridge (for 6-12s)
- Stokers Tonbridge (for 13-18s)
- Sams Maidstone and Sams Tonbridge stay and play for pre-school children and their parents

Young people and parents are regularly asked and surveyed about what they want in the future and are therefore included in planning activities. We have continued to work with the older young people to develop and prepare for further education or employment opportunities.

Offering Holiday Activities: Space 2 Be Me Time offers an opportunity for children to partake in familiar activities and parents have a period of respite knowing that their child is in a safe and supported environment. We try to run Space 2 Be Me Time in Tonbridge and Maidstone throughout the various school holidays.

Increasing membership and presence across West Kent: Our membership this year increased to 227 at year end compared to 204 in 2018 and 154 in 2017. Thanks to funding from The National Lottery Awards for All we have been able to develop how we look after and communicate with our members. We also had a major push in in raising awareness in particular in West

Kent with delivering presentations to key professionals, parent groups, schools and other organisations. This push in marketing and membership services is something that will continue into the next year.

Delivering Family Support Work across a wider area: Our family support service has continued to thrive with coverage in Maidstone, Tonbridge and Tunbridge Wells through regular coffee mornings, drop in opportunities and one to one support. We also trained staff to deliver the Cygnet autism awareness which we are licenced to deliver via Barnardo's. Space 2 Be Me was able to deliver two 6 week training programmes for parents who have children with autism during the year, one of which was in collaboration with the local authority, and we opened a waiting list of parents seeking this support from us. We would like to deliver a course in West Kent where we have not yet managed to reach and we know there is demand.

Independent Support Programme: This joint Totius project came to an end in July 2018, which was an extension of a project which Space 2 Be Me and its partners had delivered for several years, helping parents transfer from a Statement of Special Educational Needs to an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP). There remains high demand for providing educational advice to families. Many children have inadequate EHC plans and there is still a need to support their parents to ensure they have a plan that fulfils their needs.

Kent Parents and Carers Together (Kent PACT): Space 2 Be Me is leading a new project with support from its consortium partners to help facilitate the development of a new parent carer forum for Kent following the closure of the previous organisation. From March 2019 recruitment has begun of volunteer parents to help set up a forum which will represent views of fellow parents in Kent on a strategic level. Many required improvements have been identified by Ofsted and the CQC in their joint Local Area SEND inspection in January 2019, which emphasised the urgent requirement by law for parental input into service design in education and health. Space 2 Be Me will be employing a part time coordinator to facilitate the forum and will manage the grant which is managed by Contact a Family for the Department for Education.

Enhance online presence: In the last couple of years, the name change, rebranding and enhancement of Space 2 Be Me's presence online has been significant. Including the development of our website. Work continues to boost online present, utilising social media and online booking facilities, all of which have been well received by our members. Facebook in particular remains very popular and our reach has steadily grown to 974 likes (compared to 724 in March 2018).

Broadening the Funding Base: We continued to apply to grant making trusts during the year and were successful in securing both short term project grants as well as enjoying multi-year grants that continued this year. Our grant income has grown over the past 3 years from £17,434 in 2017, to £51,833 in 2018 and £65,718 this year. However, with reduced statutory and contract income available we are now looking to develop longer term support via multiple-year funding bids where possible to be complemented by increasing income from community and corporate funding streams.

Financial review

The Statement of Financial Position "SOFA" shows the Charity's total incoming resources for the year was £123,964 (2018: £139,465). Total resources expended amounts to £129,289 (2018: £139,750). The SOFA therefore reveals net outgoing resources of £5,325.

Financial position

The Charity held fund balances at 31 March 2019 of £42,626. These funds included restricted funds of £34,230 and unrestricted funds of £8,396.

The reduced unrestricted income, partly as a result of reduced contract income and large donations, has resulted in an expenditure from the designated fund which the Trustees aim to maintain at around 3 months working salary costs, i.e. £20,000. Increasing unrestricted reserves is a priority for 2019-20.

Restricted income has increased significantly from £17,434 in 2017, £51,883 in 2018 to £65,718 in 2019, directly funding our projects and charitable activities.

Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Trustees are seeking a strategy of diversifying income streams, reviewing costs and are endeavouring to undertake regular assessments of the financial stability of the charity which is, currently, largely dependent on fundraising and grants for its income. For this reason Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the Accounting Policies.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The Trustees conduct regular assessments of the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity and are satisfied that appropriate controls are in place to mitigate our exposure to major risks. These include a financial controls policy which is reviewed at least every two years, and a designated financial reserve which is reviewed annually and monitored at regular board meetings.

Financial Risk Management Objectives and Policies

The main financial risks arising from the charity's activities are credit, liquidity, fraud and price risk.

Price Risk

The charitable company is not subject to any price risk.

Credit Risk

The charitable company does not hold any material balance sheet positions with regards to donations receivable and so does not consider credit risk a material risk.

• Liquidity Risk

The charitable company does not hold any material day to day liabilities on its balance sheet and always tries to settle any amounts owed to its creditors within the period of credit given of 30 days.

• Cash Flow Risk

The charitable company prepares monthly management accounts and reports to its Trustees on a bi-monthly basis. The Board of Trustees approves the management accounts and signs off the year end accounts. In addition, the Treasurer regularly visits the office to review financial transactions and offer support to staff. The charitable company understands its cash flow requirements and its policy is to maintain sufficient funds in a liquid form at all times to ensure that the charitable company can meet its liabilities as they fall due. The charitable company is reliant on grants and donations but these have been consistent in prior years and does not lead to any immediate concern on the level of donations received.

Reserves policy

The Directors have agreed to designate funds to cover staff costs in case the charity needs to be closed. Based on average staff expenditure over the last financial year this means that £20,000 has been designated as a contingency fund. Where this has fallen low at the year end the Trustees are determined that this will be back to £20,000 by the end of the year and are implementing a strategy to enable this goal.

Principal funding

There are several principal sources of funding for the organisation, most notably a KCC Disabled Children's services grant which is in place and has been extended to March 2021 which is received as unrestricted income. The Independent Support contract which has been running since 2014 ended on 31st July 2018.

Aside from contracts, Space 2 Be Me is in the middle of multiple year grants from Children in Need for some of its Maidstone clubs, which it is currently seeking to extend, and Henry Smith in support of its Maidstone Family Support Service. New grants this year include the National Lottery Awards for All for marketing and membership development, the People's Postcode Trust in support of employability work with young people and supporting parents, and several grants via the Kent Community Foundation. In addition, Space 2 Be Me is the lead Totius partner and fund holder for facilitating the establishment of a new parent carer forum for Kent, Kent PACT, and is employing resources in order to facilitate this project.

Structure, Governance and Management

Introduction

Space 2 Be Me Ltd is registered as a charity with the Charity Commission in England and Wales (Charity Registration No. 1140764) and as a company limited by guarantee (Company Registration No. 07324545) and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Space 2 Be Me Ltd was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 23 July 2010 and was registered as a charity on 10 March 2011. It is a parent driven members organisation that recognises that the experiences and knowledge parents bring should be valued and used as the building block for service development and provision for disabled children and their families in Maidstone.

The Trustees

All Trustees give of their time freely and no Trustee remuneration was paid in the year.

Appointment of Trustees

The Board of Trustees must comprise between at least 50% and 70% of parents of disabled children and young people. However, the charitable company recognises that a range of skills is required within the Board if the charity is to develop and two non-parent trustees with professional business and finance backgrounds continue to bring an active and positive contribution to the organisation.

Trustees are nominated and selected by Directors at the Annual General Meeting. A third of the Trustees retire in rotation at the Annual General Meeting but can stand for re-election. The AGM of the charitable company was on 28th March 2019. The articles of Association require a minimum of 3 trustees and a maximum of 12.

Structure and Decisions

Staff in the charity report to the Manager who is responsible for the day to day operation of the organisation. The Board meet typically bi-monthly in addition to the appointed officer positions of Chair and Treasurer leading on specific areas of work. These include having a named safeguarding lead for both children and vulnerable adults, a lead for Policies and Procedures and a Quality lead. Existing Policies and Procedures of the charity are reviewed regularly and amended to reflect current best practice with additional policies added as required to reflect the growing operations of the charity.

The staff team at the year end comprised the Manager (25 hours a week), an Admin and Finance Worker (15 hours a week), Children and Young Person Development Worker (31 hours a week), 1 Family Support Worker in West Kent (14 hours) and Space 2 Be Me is currently recruiting a Family Support Worker for Maidstone to work similar hours. Space 2 Be Me is also in the process of recruiting a Membership and Marketing Coordinator for 8 hours per week. In addition to these salaried staff, quality sessional staff are employed to help offer support to allow children and young people to access activities and/or where additional staff are required to ensure quality delivery.

Plans for future periods

Our two-year strategy came to an end in March 2018 and during the current year we have been revisiting the business plan and starting to pull a longer-term strategy into place. It has been a period of internal change and consolidation following rapid change and significant growth, not least absorbing a sister charity based in West Kent, some major contract projects coming to an end and significant new projects beginning. There has also been a change in management with a six-month period of handover to December 2018 as new Manager, Fiona Pender replaced outgoing Director, Claire Haffenden.

Space 2 Be Me started its strategic planning for the future with a SWOT Analysis and planning session including input from all Trustees and staff in September 2018. Since then there has been a great deal of thought and discussion around how to build on existing and previous business plans to create a vision for future activities, a diversified fundraising strategy and to develop an impact measurement framework. This is a major focus for the next financial year.

Space 2 Be Me has been in the process of reviewing costs, developing robust forecasts and fine tuning its fundraising strategy and will continue to do so throughout the forthcoming year at regular Trustee meetings. To enable this, Space 2 Be Me will be migrating its financial processes to a cloud-based system which will provide greater accuracy and efficiency of analysis. Addressing the income balance is a priority.

Building on the success of developing trust and foundation support over the previous two years, work has been done on mapping out the requirements and costs of all 16 of the charity's current projects and we have built into our plans members' requests for piloting some of our work in Tunbridge Wells. Some large bids for family support and youth group projects were in progress by the year end for multi-year funding which would, if successful, bring security and sustainability to the larger part of our projects.

Other project funding sources are being researched, reviewed and pursued including those that might support Space 2 Be Me in developing its strategy and assessing its impact so that it can inform its next business plan with an independent assessment.

The Trustees and management have also been developing a strategy to pursue alternative revenue streams, in particular to boost unrestricted income levels – such as developing community fundraising, corporate support, regular donations and registering for gift aid to help boost donations coming in.

In the last quarter of the year there was some success with this strategy, having secured support from a number of local organisations such as Rotary clubs and we have been nominated as Charity of the Year by three companies which will bear fruit during the next financial year. We have also been helping to plan and support a third-party celebrity football fundraising event associated with a local Waitrose distribution centre which it is hoped will raise around £10,000 to be split between two charities, of which Space 2 Be Me is one. Space 2 Be Me aims to develop its volunteer base, and in particular a Fundraising Committee to which we hope to attract volunteers from among our members and the community at large to help us develop alternative revenue streams as well as utilising internal resources and expertise.

Beside our fundraising strategy, there remain some obvious areas to include in our plans, namely:

- Continuing to deliver our core services including clubs, family support work, family activities and outings, and training for parents
- Seeking feedback from both parents and children on our work so that we ensure we are delivering the most relevant
 activities to them and adapting to meet needs
- Improving our profile, particularly within the Tunbridge Wells and Tonbridge and Malling districts
- Transitioning from the end of the Independent Support contract towards a new way of delivering a combined
 education and family advice service and working alongside our consortium partners to ensure consistency across a
 wider area
- To help facilitate the establishment of Kent PACT so that parents have a voice in public service design and delivery for their children.

By continuing to deliver in these priority areas the Board of Trustees is confident that Space 2 Be Me Ltd will continue to provide services for families of disabled children and young people that offer public benefit and meet our charitable objectives and vision.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 31 March 2019

1. Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006

Space 2 Be Me Ltd meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

1.2 Company status

The company is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per member of the company.

1.3 Income

All income is recognised once the company has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

1.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the company and include project management carried out at Headquarters.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the company and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Costs of generating funds are costs incurred in attracting voluntary income, and those incurred in trading activities that raise funds.

Charitable activities and Governance costs are costs incurred on the company's operations, including support costs and costs relating to the governance of the company apportioned to charitable activities.

All expenditure is inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

1.5 Financial instruments

The company only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

1.6 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year.

1.7 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the company and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the company for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income, gains and losses are allocated to the appropriate fund.
