The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2017.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of a holding company. The company owns the entire share capital of Oldham BSF Limited. This company develops and operates projects under the Government's Building Schools for the Future scheme.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The profit for the financial year was £72,000 (2016: £223,000)

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company will continue to act as holding company to Oldham BSF Limited.

Both the level of business and the year end financial positions were in line with budgets and expectations.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks facing the business are that the value of investment in the undertaking, which is dependent on the success of the underlying project, might be less than anticipated and the risk that Oldham BSF Holdings Limited might have to inject cash into the undertaking to maintain its value. The directors manage this risk through close involvement in the management of the underlying project and regular monitoring of its performance.

DIVIDENDS

The directors have recommended the payment of an interim dividend of £72,000 (2016: £223,000)

POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

There have been no material post balance sheet events which would require disclosure or adjustment to these financial statements.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with UK Accounting Standards, and are presented in pound sterling which is the functional currency of the company and have been rounded to the nearest £1,000, unless specified otherwise.

Statement of compliance

Oldham BSF Holdings Limited is a limited company incorporated in England. The Registered Office is 3 More London Riverside, London SE1 2AQ. The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102 and the Companies Act 2006 for the year ended 31 December 2017.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company is a qualifying entity as defined by FRS 102. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemption set out in Section 1.12 not to prepare a statement of cashflows.

Preparation of consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about Oldham BSF Holdings Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company is exempt under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertaking are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its parent, International Public Partnerships Limited Partnership.

Investment in subsidiaries

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are recognised at cost less provision for any impairment in value.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The directors believe the going concern basis to be appropriate as Oldham BSF Limited has committed banking facilities to cover all projected expenditure during construction and is sufficiently cash generative thereafter to fully repay the debt and other expenses.

Related party disclosures

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Section 33.1 A Related Party Disclosures not to disclose related party transactions between two or more members of a group provided that any subsidiary which is a party to the transaction is wholly owned by such a member.

Short term debtors and creditors

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income in the administrative expenses.

Interest receivable and similar income

Interest receivable is credited to the profit and loss account as it is earned.

Interest payable and similar charges

Interest payable is charged to the profit and loss account as it is incurred.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amount reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates.

There are no significant accounting estimates or judgements required in the preparation of these financial statements.

2. STAFF COSTS

The company had no employees in the year (2016: none) and hence there were no staff costs for the year ended 31 December 2017 (2016: £nil).

3. **OPERATING PROFIT**

The directors received no salary, fees or other benefits in the performance of their duties in respect of their services to the company (2016: £nil). The audit fee of £551 (2016: £538) for the company is borne by Oldham BSF Limited.

Factors affecting the tax charges in future years

A reduction in UK corporation tax rate from 20% to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) was substantively enacted on 26 October 2015. Further reductions to 18% (effective 1 April 2020) was substantively enacted on 26 October 2015, and an additional reduction to 17% (effective 1 April 2020) was substantively enacted on 6 September 2016. This will reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly. The deferred tax asset at 31 December 2017 has been calculated based on these rates.

During the year ended 31 December 2017, the company recognised an interest accrual of £27,000 (2016: £8,000) payable to Oldham Educational Partnership Limited, a company in which the International Public Partnerships Limited group has joint control.
