NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Goodwill - over 20 years Website Development - over 3 years

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Freehold Property - over 50 years Fixtures & Fittings - over 10 years Equipment - over 3 years

Investment properties

Investment properties are valued annually and shown in the accounts at open market value. Gains or losses in respect of revaluing properties are recognised in the Statement of Total Recognised Gains and Losses, except in the case where the loss is deemed to be a permanent diminution in value, in which case it is charged to the profit and loss account. No depreciation is charged on this class of fixed asset. This treatment follows the principles outlined in the Standard Statement of Accounting Practice 19 (Accounting for Investment Properties) and is a departure from Financial Reporting Standard 15 (Tangible Fixed Assets), which requires all tangible fixed assets to be depreciated. This departure is necessary in order to give a true and fair view.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

2. GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the directors believe that the Company's operations will pick up in the foreseeable future due to extensive marketing campaign which will increase the Company's turnover. In the short term, the Company continues to be supported by other Companies within the C&C Alpha Group.
