Principal activity

The principal activity of the company is to administer shared equity transactions on behalf of a third party, under two Shared Equity Proceeds Agreements dated 18 April 2011. Under the agreements, the company bears no risk in relation to the shared equity transactions entered into on behalf of the third parties and, accordingly, such transactions are not reflected in the company's balance sheet. On 12 February 2016 the shared equity portfolio was sold by the third party.

Results and dividends

The result for the year ended 31 December 2015 is set out in the profit and loss account on page 4. The directors are unable to recommend the payment of a dividend (2014: £nil).

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Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1. Accounting policies

Emerald Shared Equity Limited (the "company") is a company limited by shares and incorporated and domiciled in the UK.

These company financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland ("FRS 102") as issued in August 2014. The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling.

In the transition to FRS 102 from old UK GAAP, the company has made no measurement and recognition adjustments.

The company's parent undertaking, Miller Homes Holdings Limited includes the company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of Miller Homes Holdings Limited are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU and are available to the public and may be obtained from the address in note 9. In these financial statements, the company is considered to be a qualifying entity (for the purposes of this FRS) and has applied the exemptions available under FRS 102 in respect of the following disclosures:

- The reconciliation of the number of shares outstanding from the beginning to the end of the period has not been included a second time;
- The disclosures required by FRS 102.11 Basic Financial Instruments and FRS 102.12 Other Financial Instrument Issues in respect of financial instruments not falling within the fair value accounting rules of Paragraph 36(4) of Schedule 1;
- · Cash Flow Statement and related notes; and
- Key Management Personnel compensation.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements. On first time adoption of FRS 102, the company has not retrospectively changed its accounting under old UK GAAP for derecognition of financial assets and liabilities before the date of transition.

Measurement convention

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis.

Going concern

It is the intention of the directors to wind up the company in the near future as the shared equity portfolio held by the third party was disposed of on 12 February 2016. For this reason the directors' assessment is that the company is no longer a going concern and therefore, the financial statements have not been prepared on a going concern basis.

Turnover

Turnover represents handling fees earned by the company on the recovery of shared equity loan transactions entered into with customers of McInerney Homes Limited (In Administration) and by Ludgate Hill Developments Limited.

As the company bears no risk in relation to the relevant shared equity transactions, such transactions are not reflected in the company's balance sheet.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Basis of accounting

As the company's results are consolidated within its ultimate parent company, The Miller Homes Group (UK) Limited, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in Financial Reporting Standard 102 section 33 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the group (or investees of the group qualifying as related parties).

Basic financial instruments

Trade and other debtors / creditors

Trade and other debtors are recognised initially at transaction price less attributable transaction costs. Trade and other creditors are recognised initially at transaction price plus attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses in the case of trade debtors. If the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, for example if payment is deferred beyond normal business terms, then it is measured at the present value of future payments discounted at a market rate of instrument for a similar debt instrument.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits.

2. Auditor remuneration

Auditor remuneration is borne by Miller Homes Limited, a fellow subsidiary undertaking in the current and previous year and is disclosed in the accounts of that company.

3. Directors' emoluments and employees

The company has no employees (2014: nil). The directors did not receive any remuneration from the company during the year (2014: £nil).

7. Contingent liability

Pursuant to an Old Shared Equity Agreement and a New Shared Equity Agreement, both entered into by the company on 18 April 2011, the company has granted fixed and floating charges over the company's assets in favour of McInerney Homes Limited (In Administration) and Ludgate Hill Developments Limited respectively, as a continuing security for the payment or discharge of the secured liabilities as defined in the respective agreements.

8. Accounting estimates and judgements

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The company believes that there are no areas of material estimation uncertainty which affect the financial results.

Critical accounting judgements in applying the company's accounting policies

The company believes that the major judgement applied is the use of the going concern principle which supports the valuation of assets included in the Balance sheet.

9. Immediate and ultimate parent company

The company's immediate parent company is Miller Homes Holdings Limited and its ultimate parent company is The Miller Homes Group (UK) Limited. Both companies are registered in Scotland and incorporated in Great Britain.

The largest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by The Miller Homes Group (UK) Limited. The smallest group in which they are consolidated is that headed by Miller Homes Holdings Limited. The consolidated financial statements of these groups are available to the public and may be obtained from the Registrar of Companies, Companies House, 4th Floor, Edinburgh Quay 2, 139 Fountainbridge, Edinburgh, EH3 9FF.

At the date of approval of these financial statements the company was controlled by GSO Capital Partners LP, a division of the Blackstone Group LP.
