Be Active continues to operate Burgess Park Tennis Centre with no increase in court fees since 2011. We also continue with our low cost junior coaching fees through the year.

By providing concessional and free tennis places on our junior coaching we have continued to provide over £100,000 in value to the local community. Maximum prices remain at £3.75 per hour and the average hourly payment is far less. We provided free places for children from the local Aylesbury Estate and have discounts for low income households. The children benefit from improved health and fitness, improved self-esteem from learning a new skill, the chance to make friends and to learn a game that can keep them fit and active their whole lives.

Southwark Council are the landlord. Disappointingly there is still no clarity from the Council about developing a long-term plan for tennis in the borough. This is despite a petition in May 2017 and a follow up meeting in July 2018.

We lost our grant funding from BOOST in December 2018 due to the uncertainties around our lease from the Council. We have close links with the Charity Southwark City Tennis Club. We attend meetings and discuss the programme of activities and make alterations based on their feedback. We participate in Burgess Sports and one of our Directors is a Trustee. This is a grouping of the ten community clubs in the park. We are affiliated to the Lawn Tennis Association and have been a member of the Living Wage Foundation since 2017.
