### Directors' Report For the Year Ended 31 March 2022

The Directors present their report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2022. The Company is taking advantage of the small companies exemption provided by section 414B of the Companies Act 2006 in not preparing the Strategic Report.

#### Principal activity

The principal activity of the Company during the year under review was the provision of governance services. The Directors do not anticipate any change in the nature of these activities.

#### Results and dividends

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £2,638,094 (2021 - loss 3,000,658).

#### Principal risks and uncertainties

The Company operates systems and controls to mitigate any adverse effects across the range of risks that it faces. The Company has no significant exposure to price, credit, liquidity or interest rate risk.

The directors have continued to monitor the impact of Brexit and COVID-19 on the company and the wider economy. The directors have not currently identified any material impact as a consequence of these factors and the company is well positioned to be able to react to any future developments.

In February 2022, Russian armed forces invaded Ukraine with the intention of ousting the current Presidential regime. The international community responded by placing sanctions on the Russian economy and certain individuals associated with the Russian government. The company is not exposed to any Russian investments either directly or in the investment strategies and does not have exposure to Russian investors. The directors will monitor the impact of the conflict and the wider market contagion closely, however, there is minimal impact on the ongoing business activity of the company.

#### **Going Concern**

The Company is currently in a start-up phase with revenues of £143,689 (2021: £185,500) and as a result it continues to make an operating loss. The Company's forecast, taking into account expectations around future fundraising, show that the Company will be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due, however, there is a risk that future fundraising may not be successful. These conditions indicate the existence of a material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. The Directors are confident that the Company will be successful in raising future finance and if that is not the case, a cost reduction plan will be implemented to ensure that the Company continues to be a going concern and continues in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The Directors have initiated plans for fundraising which are at an advanced stage.

Thus, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparation of the financial statements.

## 1. Accounting policies

#### 1.1 General Information

Byhiras (Europe) Limited is a private limited company which is limited by shares. It is registered in the United Kingdom. The address of its registered office and principal place of business is 15 St Helen's Place, London, EC3A 6DE.

# 1.2 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards including Financial Reporting Standard 102 - "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102"), and with the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgment in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 2).

FRS 102 allows a qualifying entity certain disclosure exemptions, subject to certain conditions, which have been complied with, including notification of and no objection to, the use of exemptions by the Company's shareholders.

In preparing these financial statements, the Company has taken advantage of the following exemptions:

- from presenting a statement of cash flows, as required by Section 7 'Statement of Cash Flows';
- II. from disclosing key management personnel compensation, as required by FRS 102 paragraph 33.7
- III. from presenting a reconciliation of the number of shares outstanding at the beginning and end of the year, as required by FRS 102 paragraph 4.12; and

On the basis that equivalent disclosures are given in the consolidated financial statements the Company has also taken advantage of the exemption not to provide:

Turnover represents the amount derived from the provision of governance services to clients during the year. Turnover is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the turnover can be reliably measured. Turnover is measured as the fair value of the consideration received, and it is only recognised on an accruals basis when the services have been performed, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

#### 1.5 Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially recognised at cost. After recognition, under the cost model, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any accumulated impairment losses.

All intangible assets are considered to have a finite useful life. If a reliable estimate of the useful life cannot be made, the useful life shall not exceed ten years.

#### 1.6 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised within 'administrative expenses' in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

## 1.7 Operating leases: Lessee

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Comprehensive Income on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

#### 1.8 Debtors

Short and long term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

# 1.9 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

# 1.10 Creditors

Short-term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans; are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

# 1.11 Government grants

Grants are accounted under the accruals model as permitted by FRS 102. Grants of a revenue nature are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income in the same period as the related expenditure.

#### 1.12 Foreign currency translation

#### \* Functional and presentation currency

The Company's functional and presentational currency is Pound Sterling ("GBP").

#### Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate. Non-monetary items measured at historical cost are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items measured at fair value are measured using the exchange rate when fair value was determined.

Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of transactions and from the translation at period-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in profit or loss except when deferred in other comprehensive income as qualifying cash flow hedges.

Foreign exchange gains and losses that relate to borrowings and cash and cash equivalents are presented in the Statement of Comprehensive Income within 'finance income or costs'. All other foreign exchange gains and losses are presented in profit or loss within 'administrative expenses'.

Where share options are awarded to employees, the fair value of the options at the date of grant is charged to profit or loss over the vesting period. Non-market vesting conditions are taken into account by adjusting the number of equity instruments expected to vest at each reporting date so that, ultimately, the cumulative amount recognised over the vesting period is based on the number of options that eventually vest. Market vesting conditions are factored into the fair value of the options granted. The cumulative expense is not adjusted for failure to achieve a market vesting condition.

The fair value of the award also takes into account non-vesting conditions. These are either factors beyond the control of either party (such as a target based on an index) or factors which are within the control of one or other of the parties (such as the Company keeping the scheme open or the employee maintaining any contributions required by the scheme).

The Company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. A defined contribution plan is a pension plan under which the Company pays fixed contributions into a separate entity. Once the contributions have been paid the Company has no further payment obligations.

The contributions are recognised as an expense in profit or loss when they fall due. Amounts not paid are shown in accruals as a liability in the Statement of Financial Position. The assets of the plan are held separately from the Company in independently administered funds.

# 1.15 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in profit or loss using the effective interest method.

#### 1.16 Provisions for liabilities

Provisions are made where an event has taken place that gives the Company a legal or constructive obligation that probably requires settlement by a transfer of economic benefit, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

#### 1.17 Current and deferred taxation

The tax expense for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in profit or loss except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the reporting date, except that:

- The recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits; and
- Any deferred tax balances are reversed if and when all conditions for retaining associated tax allowances have been met.

Deferred tax balances are not recognised in respect of permanent differences except in respect of business combinations, when deferred tax is recognised on the differences between the fair values of assets acquired and the future tax deductions available for them and the differences between the fair values of liabilities acquired and the amount that will be assessed for tax. Deferred tax is determined using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date:
