Notes to the Financial Statements

1. General information

The company is registered in England & Wales with registered number 07659017.

The registered office address is 5th Floor, One New Change, London, EC4M 9AF.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Valuation of investments

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

2.3 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.4 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.5 Financial instruments

Debt instruments (other than those wholly repayable or receivable within one year), including loans and other accounts receivable and payable, are initially measured at present value of the future cash flows and subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Debt instruments that are payable or receivable within one year, typically trade debtors and creditors, are measured, initially and subsequently, at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received. However, if the arrangements of a short-term instrument constitute a financing transaction, like the payment of a trade debt deferred beyond normal business terms or financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate or in case of an out-right short-term loan not at market rate, the financial asset or liability is measured, initially, at the present value of the future cash flow discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument and subsequently at amortised cost.

Financial assets that are measured at cost and amortised cost are assessed at the end of each reporting period for objective evidence of impairment. If objective evidence of impairment is found, an impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of comprehensive income.

For financial assets measured at amortised cost, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. If a financial asset has a variable interest rate, the discount rate for measuring any impairment loss is the current effective interest rate determined under the contract.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.6 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.7 Share based payments

Share option agreements exist for employees of the subsidiary company, Lovespace Limited in relation to potential shares in this company.

The accounting for the fair value of options granted to employees of the subsidiary is treated as an increase in the cost of the investment in that subsidiary.

Where share options are awarded to employees of the subsidiary company, the fair value of the options at the date of grant is charged to the Statement of comprehensive income in the subsidiary over the vesting period. Non-market vesting conditions are taken into account by adjusting the number of equity instruments expected to vest at each Balance sheet date so that, ultimately, the cumulative amount recognised over the vesting period is based on the number of options that eventually vest. Market vesting conditions are factored into the fair value of the options granted. The cumulative expense is not adjusted for failure to achieve a market vesting condition.

The fair value of the award also takes into account non-vesting conditions. These are either factors beyond the control of either party (such as a target based on an index) or factors which are within the control of one or other of the parties (such as the Company keeping the scheme open or the employee maintaining any contributions required by the scheme).

Where the terms and conditions of options are modified before they vest, the increase in the fair value of the options, measured immediately before and after the modification, is also charged to Statement of comprehensive income in the subsidiary over the remaining vesting period.

2.8 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in the Statement of comprehensive income using the effective interest method.

3. Employees

The average monthly number of employees, including directors, during the year was 6 (2015 -4).

Share premium account

Share premium account - includes any premiums received on issue of share capital. Any transaction costs associated with the issuing of shares are deducted from share premium.

Capital redemption reserve

Capital redemption reserve - represents the nominal value of share capital purchased by the company.

Other reserves

Share option reserve - represents the value of equity-settled share options granted.

Profit & loss account

Profit & loss account - includes all current and prior period retained profits and losses.

9. Share based payments

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available to small entities in relation to accounting for share based payments for share options which were granted prior to the start of the first reporting period under FRS 102.

In October 2016, 19,237,966 options were granted. They have an exercise price of 4.3p. The Black Scholes model was used to determine the fair value at grant date; key inputs were expected volatility of 50%, risk free rate of 2%, the exercise price of 4.3p and expected life to 31 December 2019. The total expense for the period is £16,926.

Of the options granted during 2016, 4,250,000 are part of an EMI scheme and 14,987,966 are part of an unapproved scheme. Of these options, 1,000,000 and 14,987,966 respectively are options granted to directors of the company and of its subsidiary.

10. Post balance sheet events

In December 2016, Mailstorage Limited received a signed subscription agreement from InteSpace (Proprietary) Limited agreeing to subscribe for 23,208,654 shares at 4.3087376 pence each, totalling £1m in consideration. Following the year end, subscriptions for a further 2,968,304 shares at 4.3087376 pence were received from 14 individuals, resulting in a total consideration of £127,896.33. All 26,176,958 shares were allotted on 8th March 2017.

11. First time adoption of FRS 102

The policies applied under the entity's previous accounting framework are not materially different to FRS 102 and have not impacted on equity or profit or loss.
