Covid-19

As our financial year drew to a close, The COVID-19 pandemic created and continues to create, an unprecedented period of disruption.

Our holiday letting activity has been suspended in line with Government guidelines. The financial impact in the new year depends on whether the restrictions will be lifted for the busy summer period, but we have been able to gain access to Government support to mitigate the effects.

The impact of COVID-19 has created uncertainty on property values in the short term. However, in line with declarations from the Royal Society of Chartered Surveyors, the values expressed should be viewed with some caution given the uncertainty which faces the UK economy at the present time.

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Directors' Report

Statement of directors responsibilities

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration derived from the principal activites of the company.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulative depreciation and any accumulative impairment losses. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold property, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold property

Fixtures, fittings and office equipment

25% to 33% straight line

Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price). Loans and other financial liabilities are initially recognised at transaction price net of any transaction costs and subsequently measured at amortised cost determined using the effective interest method.

Taxation

A current tax liability is recognised for the tax payable on the taxable profit of the current and past periods. A current tax asset is recognised in respect of a tax loss that can be carried back to recover tax paid in a previous period. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences between the recognition of income and expenses in the financial statements and their inclusion in tax assessments. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference, except for revalued land and investment property where the tax rate that applies to the sale of the asset is used. Current and deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Freehold property

Freehold property is initially recognised at cost and then subsequently measured at fair value. Changes in value are recognised in the profit and loss account.
