Business Review

As in previous years, the Dulwich Care Centre site, previously owned by T D Bailey Investments Limited, a subsidiary of Callisto Healthcare Limited, has been transferred to Capital Care Villages (Dulwich) Limited and the site is now being redeveloped into an assisted living facility.

During the year, the bank loan facility within Callisto Healthcare Limited was fully repaid.

As a result of the above changes, management will review the long term future of the company.

1. General information

The company is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 1 Battersea Square, London, SW11 3RZ.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland'.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

The company's subsidiary T.D. Bailey Investments Limited that owned the Dulwich Care Centre, closed this operation in a previous year and transferred its freehold property to another group member so that it can explore development options with the site.

As a result the company has impaired its carrying investment cost in T.D. Bailey Investments Limited resulting in a large accounting loss in previous years. This accounting adjustment is not reflected in the group accounts as the overall value remains within the group.

With the support of its parent company, the directors are confident that the company can meet its liabilities as they fall due.

Disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is wholly owned and its parent publishes a consolidated cash flow statement.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. Accounting estimates and assumptions are made concerning the future and, by their nature, will rarely equal the related actual outcome. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Revenue recognition

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for interest due, net of discounts and Value Added Tax.

3. Accounting policies *(continued)*

Investments

Fixed asset investments are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated impairment losses.

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.

For impairment testing of goodwill, the goodwill acquired in a business combination is, from the acquisition date, allocated to each of the cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination, irrespective of whether other assets or liabilities of the company are assigned to those units.

Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into.

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the profit and loss account in other administrative expenses.

Loans and borrowings are initially recognised at the transaction price including transaction costs. Subsequently, they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, less impairment. If an arrangement constitutes a finance transaction it is measured at present value.
