The company organises community running events in the West London area. During the financial year to 30th November 2019 the events have benefited the community in the following ways:

- Organised a road closed flagship event in Ealing for 5,500 entrants
- Organised a mini mile race for 1,500 children
- Organised a mini mile race for 100 school children in Southall, an area in London identified having high levels of inactivity
- Organised 2 x 10k events in Osterley Park in conjunction with the National Trust
- Organised a monthly mile series of events in Lammas Park with average attendance of 80 people and 15 volunteers ever month.
- Organised a 5 x Summer Mile evening events with average attendance of 100 children and adults and 20 volunteers at each event
- Funded the installation of a drinking fountain in Lammas Park to provide free and immediate access to fresh water for adults and children using the sports facilities in the park as well as local runners, walkers and dog walkers
- Visited local schools and presented at assemblies to encourage participation in running

 presenting to over 2,000 local children
- Arranged training for 700 local volunteers in the month leading up to the Half Marathon.
 This included roles such as team leaders, marshals, park leaders, baggage coordinators. Volunteers were from a wide range of community groups and local people
- Coached and volunteered at local parkruns and community events
- Economic impact estimated at over £3m for the flagship community event since 2012
- Driving health & wellbeing within the community through all of the above

The Directors of the company have lived in Ealing and the surrounding areas and have developed the business model based on their experience of why people want to keen fit and how we can assist in helping those that do not.

As part of race preparations every year we consult with various local community groups, many of whom are now involved in the event.

We meet with the Active Sports team at Ealing council to update them on our progress as well as regular communication with England Athletics.

We regularly visit schools to talk about the benefits of running.

We attend local ward forums as well as Yearly Safety Advisory Group meetings.

We send out 30,000 letters to local residents talking about the Ealing Half Marathon.

We have a number of active social media accounts through which we have a combined total of followers of over 18,000 people, many of whom are local to the area.
