The relevant period Dec 2020 to Nov 2021 was still during the pandemic and so our activities across the year were reflective of what was possible during restrictions:

We hosted two very successful virtual events that encouraged local people to get outdoors and run or walk:

- Osterley Park 10k Virtual, Dec 2020 instead of an in-person event, this challenge
  was to complete 10k, either walking or running over a period of ten days during the
  month of December 2020. We had over 500 participants, many who had never taken
  part in our events before. For every entry a donation was made to Ealing Foodbank,
  which resulted in donations of over £13,500
- Queen of the Suburbs Virtual Challenge Two, May 2021 this followed on from our very successful first Queen of the Suburbs Challenge in Oct 2020. Participants were asked to visit 13 specific parks spread out across the entire borough of Ealing. They had the whole of October to complete the challenge and could run, walk or cycle. Once, again, this proved very popular, encouraging people to be physically active
- during 'lockdown' and also visit parts of their local area that they wouldn't normally. We had over 300 participants.

As restrictions were lifted we returned to in-person events:

- Ealing Half Marathon our flagship event returned in Sept 2021 with just under 4,000 participants and almost 200 volunteers.
- Ealing Mini-Mile taking place over the Ealing Half Marathon (EHM) weekend, this
- extremely popular event consists of eight separate runs with 2,000 children taking part from extremely young (in the family event) to aged 15.
  - Ealing Sunset Mile the third event of the EHM weekend also returned with 75 participants and 20 volunteers.
  - Ealing Mile this monthly lunchtime event returned in Sept 2021 and attracted an average of 75 participants each month and provides around 20 volunteering opportunities. It is particularly popular with pensioners and homemakers because of its weekday daytime slot.

The Directors of the company live in Ealing and the surrounding areas and have developed the business model based on their experience of why people want to keen fit and how we can assist in helping those that do not.

As part of race preparations every year we consult with various local community groups, many of whom are now involved in the event.

We meet with the Active Sports team at Ealing council to update them on our progress as well as regular communication with England Athletics.

We attend local ward forums as well as Yearly Safety Advisory Group meetings.

During the pandemic, we were very visible on social media, encouraging physical activity and creating the above virtual events.

We also built a new relationship with, and helped raise awareness of the local Ealing Foodbank charity, raising over £13,500 in December 2020 via one of our virtual events.
