OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

Clinical Movement Analysis Society UK and Ireland (CMAS) was formed to encourage professional interaction, develop and monitor operational standards and training, and to stimulate and advance scientific knowledge in the fields of clinical motion analysis.

Due to COVID-19, the Annual General Meeting due to be hosted in London in April 2020 was cancelled. In its place a 'virtual' combined AGM and scientific was hosted on-line in November 2020.

Over the past year CMAS has continued to promote high standards of the practice of clinical gait analysis in the scientific field and to monitor and improve the operation of clinical gait laboratories in the United Kingdom and Ireland by the provision of a set of operational quality standards for clinical movement analysis and accreditation services for clinical gait laboratories in the United Kingdom and Ireland.

The Directors confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2011.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The directors consider that the performance of the company's first period under review has been satisfactory. Income from all sources for the period amounted to £13,685 for the period. Expenditure amounted to £16,426 giving rise to a deficit of £2,741 in the year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The reserves are currently standing at a satisfactory level. It is the directors' aim to maintain reserves at a reasonable level to ensure the long term financial security of the organisation.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The charity's aims for the future are to increase membership and encourage more centres to join the accreditation process.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with The Charities (Accounts and Reports)
Regulations 2008 and the statement of Recommended Practic1e "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005 ("SORP"). These financial statements are drawn up under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis, which the trustees believe is appropriate.

Incoming resources

Incoming resources comprises of membership fees, audit and accreditation fees, and fees and sponsorship for the annual meeting. They are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

No amounts are included within the accounts for services donated by volunteers.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

The charity has one fund, which is unrestricted. It is available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.
