## OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

The objects of the charity are specifically restricted to the following:

To further or benefit the residents of Derwenlas, Glaspwll and the neighbourhood, without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions by associating together the said residents and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.

In exercising their powers the trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission.

## ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During this financial year the refurbishment work on our kitchen was completed with the help of the grants we received in 2020 from Powys County Council and the National Lottery Community Fund (Awards for All). Covid restrictions continued to affect the use of the premises and we took the oppurtunity to undertake further refurbishment work, this time on the main hall, while the centre was closed. A large area of the internal wall has been re-plastered and we were extremely grateful to receive a grant from Garthgwynion Charities for the complete redecoration of the main hall. This work was almost complete by the end of the financial year and we were able to re-open in April 2022.

We have commissioned the outstanding refurbishment work to our front boundary and are looking forward to the installation of a new fence and gate during the coming year. A huge thank you to Charlie Falzon who stepped down as Company Director and Charity Trustee in September 2021. We are grateful to him for his hard work as Chair and for securing funds for much needed improvements to our facilities. A big thank you also to all committee members who have worked so hard to make these projects happen during difficult times. We are delighted with our new improved kitchen and our newly decorated hall and we are very happy to see the centre open for use again by the community.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities shows total income of £5,423 and expenditure of £19,344 resulting in net expenditure of £13,922.

## TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are also company directors for the purpose of company law. # 1. Accounting Policies

# a) Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Canolfan Cymunedol Derwenlas Community Centre meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

## b) Fund accounting

## i) Restricted funds

Grants received from public sector bodies and others to be used in furtherance of particular aspects of the objects of the charity are separated and treated as restricted funds.

## ii) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity and are available as general funds.

## c) Income

All income is recognised once the company has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

# d) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified by the type of expenditure.

# e) Creditors and Provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.
