

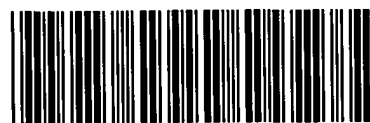

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

The objects of the charity are specifically restricted to the following:

To further or benefit the residents of Derwenlas, Glaspwll and the neighbourhood, without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions by associating together the said residents and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.

In exercising their powers the trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Following closure due to Covid and the refurbishment of the kitchen and hall, we were delighted to be able to re-open with our new, improved facilities and decoration in April 2022. The centre has been hired for meetings, educational activities, parties, dances, music and film and by our regular users the brownies and guides. In addition, the committee organised some very successful community events throughout the year, including a summer Fun Day, Halloween Party, and our annual Christmas party. It has been a pleasure to welcome people back to the centre and to hear that the improvements are much appreciated.

We have continued to plan further improvements during the year, including a much needed new front fence and gate, using the remaining funds from the grant we received from Powys County Council. These are due to be installed shortly and will provide a more secure boundary to the outdoor space as well as greatly enhancing the external appearance of the centre. Future plans include the installation of curtains to improve heat conservation, acoustics and provide black out function. We will be researching further energy saving measures as well as improvements to the toilets and to the outside space over the coming year.

At the beginning of this financial year the redecoration work in the hall was completed thanks to a grant provided by Garthgwynion and the centre re-opened in May 2022. We also commissioned a new gate and fence as part of the refurbishment work funded by Powys County Council.

We have been very happy to see the centre back in use.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities shows total income of £2,678 and expenditure of £11,787 resulting in net expenditure of £9,109.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

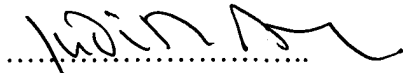

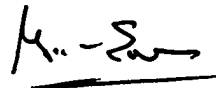

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the Year Ended 28th February 2023

1. Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities : Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Canolfan Cymunedol Derwenlas Community Centre meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

b) Fund accounting

i) Restricted funds

Grants received from public sector bodies and others to be used in furtherance of particular aspects of the objects of the charity are separated and treated as restricted funds.

ii) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity and are available as general funds.

c) Income

All income is recognised once the company has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

d) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified by the type of expenditure.

e) Creditors and Provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.
