2 OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The key aims of the GHC are:

- To educate the general public, and in particular young people, about gliding.
- To raise the awareness and improve the understanding of gliding as a sport and to attract new people so that they can benefit from participating.
- To preserve vintage gliders, historical gliding artefacts, knowledge and skills that would otherwise be lost to the nation.
- To establish an archive of important documents, records and plans, and to make these available in an easily accessible form.

The main activities during this reporting period have been:

- Providing guided tours for visitors to the centre.
- Extending, maintaining and restoring the collection of vintage gliders. Four gliders were donated to the GHC during 2015/16 bringing the total in the collection to twenty.

3 FINANCIAL REVIEW

3.1 Funds

The GHC has two funds:

a. The Unrestricted Fund

This fund covers the running costs of the centre. The income for the fund comes from the following sources:

- Membership fees
- Donations made for this specific purpose
- Contributions from members who enjoy the incidental benefit of flying the GHC gliders or keeping their gliders in the hangar so that they can be displayed to visitors.

b. The Restricted Fund.

The restricted fund is used to establish and develop the GHC. The income for the fund comes from donations given for this purpose. The main expenditure from the fund during 2015/16 was the cost of purchasing and restoring vintage gliders.

3.2 Assets

The main assets of the GHC are the hangar and the 20 vintage gliders. The gliders are listed as heritage assets and the detail are given in Note 6.

This gain reflects the revaluation of the Foka 4 following restoration.

Note 5

The major tangible asset is the hangar. The policy is to depreciate the value of the hangar (and any additions) linearly over 25 years so that it is reduced at 4% of the original cost per year. There is a minor correction for previous years in the table. This is because in the accounts for 2013/14 and 2014/15 the depreciation was incorrectly calculated as 4% of the value in the previous year rather than 4% of the original cost. A summary of the valuation of the hangar is given in the table below.

Note 6

The current heritage assets consist of the vintage gliders together with their trailers and other equipment which have been donated to the GHC. The current collection is listed in the table below which also shows how the collection has grown since the GHC was formed in 2013.

The value of vintage gliders is difficult to estimate as the potential market is small and they only change hands infrequently. The figures in the table have been based on recent sales of similar gliders. It is expected that the values the GHC gliders will be static or will possibly increase over time. If appropriate they are re-valued following restoration.

^{*} The Foka 4 was re-valued following restoration

- ** The Scott Viking was purchased from its Dutch owner and then donated to the GHC. The money was raised in two ways. Dutch members of the GHC paid £3820 directly to the owner. The balance (£2010) was donated to the GHC by British members and supporters. This appears under "Donations to Acquire Gliders" in the Table of Income under Note 1. (The figure is slightly higher than £2010 due to variations in the exchange rate. The transaction was carried out in Euros)
- *** The Lo 100 is incomplete. The fuselage and tail have been used as a basis for a simulator. The value in the table includes the extra computer equipment that has been added (all of which was donated).

A summary analysis of heritage asset transactions is given in the table below. There have been no direct purchases, charges for impairment or disposals since the charity was formed in 2012. All transactions are included in the balance sheet.
