TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2014

The Trustees (who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act) present their annual report together with the financial statements of Swan Education Partnership Limited (the charity) for the year ended 31 August 2014. The Trustees confirm that the Annual report and financial statements of the company comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the company's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

CONSTITUTION

The charity is registered as a charitable company limited by guarantee with Charitable Status. The company was incorporated on 10 April 2012. The charitable company's Memorandum and Articles of Association are the primary governing documents of the charity trust.

The trustees are also the directors of the charitable company for the purposes of company law. The charitable company is known as Swan Education Partnership Limited.

Details of the Trustees who served throughout the year are included in the Reference and Administrative Details on page 1.

MEMBERS' LIABILITY

Each member of the charitable company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the charitable company in the event of it being wound up while they are a member, or within one year after they cease to be a member, such amount as may be required, not exceeding £1, for the debts and liabilities contracted before they ceased to be a member.

RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF NEW TRUSTEES

New Trustees are appointed by existing Trustees as and when required. The Charity aims to recruit new Trustees from as diverse backgrounds as possible but ensures during the recruitment process that they are eligible to act as Trustees.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Objectives and Activities

OBJECTIVES AND AIMS

The mission of the Swan Education Partnership is to provide services and advice to support the SWAN educational providers, community and staff, through quality expertise, resources and collaboration which ensures learning, development and academic excellence.

SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES

The charity's main activities are as follows;

Business Engagement Activity
Post-16 progression routes
Behaviour and Attendance partnership
Curriculum partnership

More detail of these activities can be found in the achievement and performance section.

Achievements and performance

Throughout 2013-2014, the Partnership has continued to drive forward its work in developing high quality educational provision throughout its member schools. This has been achieved through appropriate service level agreements with key providers and through the collaborative work of Headteachers and senior leaders.

Business Engagement

The partnership has continued to work with Proactive Education to deliver a significant business engagement programme. This has included a variety of activity days across the SWAN schools, including Y9 and Y10 students being involved, for example, in a hotel challenge day or a logistics challenge day. These activities involve working for the day with employers, developing an understanding of marketing, finance, communication issues, and in developing team working skills.

There have been post-16 support days, ensuring sixth form students leave school prepared for the world of work. These have included CV writing, the application process and mock interviews. Apprentice roadshows have also been available to support students in Y10 and Y11.

Work related competitions across the partnership have also taken place.

Behaviour and Attendance

Senior leaders from the member schools met regularly to share best practice and to help continue to drive improvements in behaviour and attendance across the partnership. In part, the group has managed a service level agreement with JOGO, a behaviour intervention group who have been working individually with each of the partner schools. This support has included individual and group direct student intervention work, training for school staff, and behaviour surgeries, in which teaching colleagues could gain advice for specific or more general behaviour management concerns. The direction of this work has become increasingly focused on building capacity within member schools. The group has also worked closely on identifying best practice in managing attendance, supporting increased attendance within partner schools.

Direct training run by and for the partnership has included training for support staff and year leaders.

Teaching and Learning

A second group of senior leaders from the member schools met regularly to share best practice and to help continue to drive improvements in teaching and learning across the partnership. This group has led on various courses to directly improve the quality of teaching, including an 'Improving Teacher Programme' for teachers identified as struggling with performance, and a further programme for developing the quality of middle leadership. Members of the group have also worked on supporting the development of the bid for the Teaching School Alliance, which works out of Sponne School, and which will be the vehicle for driving this work forward from September, 2014.

SWAN Challenge

The partnership has developed a peer challenge programme, built on the best practice from successful similar models. In this, each school is visited for 2.5 days by a team of trained senior staff from other partnership schools, led by a trained experienced inspector. Using RAISE data as a springboard, the challenge team visit lessons and work with staff and students at the host school to develop a challenge report, reflecting strengths seen and possible areas for improvement. Six schools were involved in the first year of this programme.

Best Practice Groups

There have been regular meetings of other groups from within the partnership schools to share and develop best practice. These have included Business Managers, Heads of Sixth Form and Exam Officers.

Planned Developments 2014-2015

In order to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the financial management of the partnership, the direct management of the finances will be undertaken by Moulton School, one of the partnership schools.

Following the successful bid from Sponne School for Teaching School status, the partnership will work within this alliance to support improved teaching, learning and outcomes for students across the partnership.

The standing groups of Behaviour and Attendance, Teaching and Learning, and Heads of Sixth will be replaced by 12 month focus groups. In 2014-2015, these will be Curriculum and Accountability, Pupil Premium, Achieving Good and Outstanding Sixth Forms, and Early Intervention to Improve Behaviour. The other best practice groups will continue.

Work will also continue through service level agreements for behaviour intervention work, employer engagement and bid writing to bring income into the partnership. This work will be managed by the individual member schools, although overseen by the Directors group.

Financial review

RESERVES POLICY

The model for our Charity is such that we do not directly employ anyone, so that to that end we do not carry a financial reserve.

In preparing this report, the Trustees have taken advantage of the small companies exemptions provided by section 415A of the Companies Act 2006.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2 Company status

The company is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the company.

1.3 Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of financial activities when the company has entitlement to the funds, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

1.5 Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the company. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the company and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:
