### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2014

The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 June 2014.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the overning document, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

#### Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee incorporated on 17th April 2012.

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the provision's of the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association.

None of the Trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the Trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

The Trustees have paid due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in deciding the activities undertaken by the Charity during the year. The Trustees are satisifed that the information provided in the report and accounts meets the public benefit reporting requirements.

#### Objectives and activities

The Charity's objects are specifically restricted to the following for the public benefit:

To advance the education of the public in general and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing children and young people in particular through provision of sport training and related opportunities, academic study and life skills experiance

To pursue such other charitable purpose or purposes according to the law of England and Wales as the Trustees in their absolute discretion shall select from time to time.

During the period the charity contracted with the foundations of two Premiership Football Clubs [Tottenham Hotspur (Spurs) and Everton] and finalised two pilot projects in their local communities. The objective was to recruit talented street smart young adults from underprivileged communities and to develop their leadership and ambassadorial skills for the benefit of those communities in the future. Twenty Seven young adults joined the two pilot programmes [15 with Spurs and 12 with Everton].

In the Spurs programme the students attended CONEL in North London on an accountancy apprenticeship course, worked for a number of leading companies in the City and elsewhere, mentored 20-30 children each from Christmas 2012 and obtained Sport coaching and leadership training from the Club.

In the Everton programme the students attended an entrepreneurship course at Liverpool Community College,mentored 20-30 children each, and obtained sports coaching ,leadership training and were engaged in a number of local community projects with the club.

At both clubs the students benefited from regular and frequent guest speakers of a very high caliber from the fields of Business, Law,Sport and Community work. In the academic year beginning in the Autumn of 2013 a second cohort of 20 young adults commenced the Leadership through Sport programme .Delivery partners were Tottenham Hotspur Foundation and the College of Haringey,Enfield and North East London [COHENEL]. For more valuable information please go to www.leadershipthroughsport.org.The news items and videos are particularly informative.

### Achievements and performance

Significant progress was made in year two of Leadership through Sport. Firstly, the cost per student dropped from £10,000 to £6,500 as more apprentices were paid for by the employers rather than indirectly via grants from the charity. More importantly a significant percentage of the first cohort's students were retained as full time staff by their apprenticeship providers. These young adults obtained jobs with top corporations where would it not have been for the programme, they would not have obtained interviews 15 months before. This employment success rate has become a new significant objective for the charity.

In 2014 OFSTED graded COHENEL's Business administration, finance and accounts Apprenticeships as Outstanding with a special mention of the 2013/14 innovative Leadership through Sort programme.

In the Summer of 2014 two new cohorts were interviewed for the academic year 14/15.

#### Financial review

In the period total incoming resources were £138,847 (2013 : £275,031) and total outgoing resources £122,825 (2013: £268,626) producing a surplus of £16,022 (2013: £6,405) for the period. At the year end the charity had net assets of £22,427 (2013 : £6,405).

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. In the first period of activity this level of reserves was not achieved but, since the period end, this target has now been attained.
