The main governing document of the charity is the trust deed dated 1st May 2012. The trustees are appointed to control and manage the charity by the society of the Living Faith Church.

Objectives and activities

The Charity's objectives are to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the statement of beliefs. The first objective of Living Faith Church is to preach the Gospel and teach the truth as revealed within the Holy Bible. To those ends the charity runs traditional Christian prayer and worship meetings on Sundays, and at times during the week, including a Wednesday evening prayer meeting. The Holy Bible is the foundation for all the work and doctrine, the church therefore has a strong emphasis on on Biblical Christianity.

The charity is also involved in serving the wider community and offers various initiatives to that end, for example: An after school club, Youth Meetings, Parents and Toddlers, Coffee Morning, Various Charity events, Food Bank, Arts and Crafts. In addition, the charity offers help and care in practical ways such as at times providing charitable financial donations, furniture, food, and other essential needs to vulnerable people throughout the community.

There is an active chaplaincy and visitation team that work in the community and residential/nursing homes. This work has developed to include Sunday Services and midweek services in around 6 different locations.

Further afield there are close links with other churches and ministries in the United Kingdom. The church has developed active links with international ministers, churches and missionary organisations.

The Lead Pastor, Bishop Dr. Steven Evans, is the presiding bishop of The International Charismatic Church Network (TICCN). This network is in ancient Apostolic Succession and is a spiritual home for Charismatic ministers to enjoy fellowship.

HOW OUR ACTIVITIES DELIVER PUBLIC BENEFIT

The chaplaincy and visitation team serves the local community. This service has been greatly appreciated by many individuals and families within the community and is provided without charge.

The charity also runs various voluntary groups that directly benefit the wider community, for example: An after school club, Youth Meetings, Parents and Toddlers, Coffee Morning, Various Charity events, Food Bank, Arts and Crafts and Counseling services.

In addition to the above, the charity offers help and care in practical ways such as at times providing charitable financial donations, furniture, food, and other essential needs to vulnerable people throughout the community.

Achievements and performance

Land to the fact that

During the last year Living Faith Church has continued to expand its work as a worshipping community with a biblical Christian ethos. The new church base in Orrell has proved to be a success, the buildings provide over double the capacity of seats for services and offer an additional church hall and cafe area.

The new buildings were in need of renovation and much of this has been done via the hard work of church volunteers who have worked alongside professionals to bring the buildings back into good order. The wider community have repeatedly offered great thanks for this transforming work and groups such as the Orrell Community Network have used the facility for their meetings.

The church hosts an increasing range of weekly meetings and these have continued to be well attended, they include: Worship services in other locations around Greater Manchester and Cheshire. Also, Bible Studies, Midweek Prayer, Home Groups, After School Clubs, Young Adults Meeting, Parents and Toddlers, Coffee Mornings and Special Meetings/Services/Conferences.

The church continues to work within the local community, this work sometimes involves working alongside agencies such as the police, schools, and various counseling services. Our Chaplaincy Ministry and Faithful friends work has continued to grow and we are now providing Services of Holy Communion into six residential homes within the Wigan borough. This ministry has made a great impact in thousands of local peoples lives since it started six years ago.

The church has hosted conferences within the last year for the OSL (Order of St Luke the Physician) 2nd year running, TICCN (The International Christian Church Network) 5th year running, and the ICFM (International Convention of Faith Ministries) 2nd year running. These were well attended and highly beneficial allowing the church access to the mission of the wider Christian community.

Financial review

The financial results for the period under review show an overall deficit of £18,404, which has been in line with Trustees' expectations and takes into account the further work to upgrade the fabric and resources of the building and grounds. The Trustees feel that, given the same economic conditions, the Church should show a small surplus at the conclusion of the next financial period.

Plans for future periods

We plan to continue to reach our community as we have been doing and to also facilitate an expanding range of services.

Our online web activities are growing and we hope to continue to develop these to improve our connections with people on a local and international level.

Year ended 31 May 2019

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Living Faith Church, 25 Church Street, Orrell, Wigan, WN5 8TG.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Companies Act 2006.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
 contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
 requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
 it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking
 activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those
 support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable
 activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Equipment

25% reducing balance

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.

For impairment testing of goodwill, the goodwill acquired in a business combination is, from the acquisition date, allocated to each of the cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination, irrespective of whether other assets or liabilities of the charity are assigned to those units.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

4. Limited by guarantee

The Company is a Company limited by guarantee having no share capital.
