2 Accounting policies

Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Statement of compliance

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'.as issued in August 2014. The amendments to FRS 102 issued in July 2015 and effective immediately have been applied. The presentation currency of these financial statements is U.S Dollars (\$).

In the transition to FRS 102 from old UK GAAP, the Company has made no measurement and recognition adjustments.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention except that as disclosed in the accounting policies certain items are shown at fair value.

The Company is itself a subsidiary company and is exempt from the requirement to prepare group accounts by virtue of section 400 of the Companies Act 2006. These financial statements therefore present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Summary of disclosure exemptions

Cash flow statement exemption

The Company is exempt from the requirement of FRS102 Section 7 to prepare a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of Alpha Partners Leasing Limited and its cash flows are included within Alpha Partners Leasing Limited's consolidated cash flow statement.

Transactions with other group subsidiaries

As the entity is a wholly owned subsidiary of Alpha Partners Leasing Limited, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS102 Section 33 and has, therefore, not disclosed transactions or balances with wholly owned subsidiaries which form part of the group.

Financial guarantee contracts

Where the Company enters into financial guarantee contracts to guarantee the indebtedness of other companies within its group, the Company considers these to be insurance arrangements and accounts for them as such. In this respect, the Company treats the guarantee contract as a contingent liability until such time as it becomes probable that the Company will be required to make a payment under the guarantee.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2015

Investments

Investments in equity shares which are not publicly traded and where fair value cannot be measured reliably are measured at cost less impairment.

Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments. If payment is deferred and the time value of money is material, the initial measurement is on a present value basis.

Dividends

Dividend distribution to the company's shareholders is recognised as a liability in the financial statements in the reporting period in which the dividends are declared.

3 Staff costs

The Company has no employees other than the Directors, who did not receive any remuneration (2014 - \$NIL).

4 Income tax

The tax on profit before tax for the year is the same as the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK (2014 - the same as the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK) of 20.25% (2014 - 21.5%).
