Governance, Structure and Management

British Syrian Education Centre Ltd (BSEC) is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 18th May 2012 and registered as a charity on 11th April 2013. The charitable company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The trustees are also directors of the charity for the purposes of Companies Act. They are appointed or reappointed annually at the Annual General Meeting. Appointment and retirement of trustees is in accordance with the Articles of Association. All trustees give their time voluntarily and received no benefits from the charity.

Reserves policy

The Board has assessed the charity's requirements for reserves in the light of the main risks to the organisation. As a result, the Board has approved a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed, should be held in reserve and maintained at a level which ensures that BSEC's core activity could continue during a period of unforeseen difficulty. The target reserve amount represents at least 6 months' (26 weeks) expenditure and will be reviewed annually.

Statement of Directors' and Trustees Responsibilities

Charity trustees are the people who serve on the governing body of a charity. They may be known as trustees, directors, board members, governors or committee members. The principles and main duties are the same in all cases.

1. Accounting basis.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2008)

The statements have also been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) – Accounting and Reporting by Charities SORP 2005 issued in March 2005

2. Cash Flow Statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small

Income is recognised in the period to which it relates, unless specified otherwise by the funder. Project funding is, in general, repayable if not expended within the relevant project.
