Neighbourworks is a business that supports people to learn new skills, make new friends and contribute to their community through traditional wool crafts. We run three projects; they are Neighbourworks, The Knit Stop, and Wool on the Exe, our retail community fibre arts space. In mid- 2016, we received additional funding from the Big Lottery Fund to expand our Knit Stop programme. This allowed us to bring on an Outreach Coordiator and in 2017, we ran 5 new groups for adults and expanded into 4 local secondary schools. Participants in our projects have told us that our projects reduce social isolation, improve confidence, and contribute to a general overall improvment in well-being. We also continue to host a variety of drop-in groups and clubs at Wool on the Exe. Twice weekly 10 or more gather to share and support each other, with many forming new, durable friendships. We also have a sock club that meets to knit socks for those less fortunate in Exeter. In 2017 we sent 917 garments knit by local people to Knit for Peace in London. We hosted over 100 workshops led by local artisans at Wool on the Exe. These workshops encouage creativity and help people make new friends.
