Report of the Independent Auditors to the Members of St Margaret's Fundraising Limited

Opinion

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

St Margaret's Fundraising Limited is a private company limited by shares. It is a wholly owned subsidiary of St Margaret's Somerset Hospice and the principal activity of the company is to organise major fundraising events on behalf of St Margaret's Somerset Hospice. The company number is 0824225, registered in England and Wales. The date of incorporation was 5 October 2012 and the Registered office is Heron Drive, Bishops Hull, Taunton, Somerset, TA1 5AH.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" including the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going Concern

The company is reliant upon the continued financial support of St Margaret's Somerset Hospice to continue in operational existence and the Trustees of the charity have confirmed they will continue to provide this support.

Currency

The functional and presentational currency is pound sterling.
