On a daily basis the DOAJ recives more than 20 000 visits from all over the world, primarily researchers, students and librarians Data from the DOAJ is harvested by many library catalogues, aggregators and search engines, facilitating the dissemination of open academic research. Number of listed journals has increased by 20%, available metadata for harvesting has increased by 40%. DOAJ is widely recognized as the authoritative source for quality open access scholarly journals.
