Equality in Tourism is activities in the year ending 04, January, 2017 were:

- 1. To increase our communications and social media with ever widening networks. We have produced three Newsletters, been active on twitter and with our blogs.
- 2. To continue to expanded our network of Associates.
- 3. Follow up on opportunities for working more closely with partners on the ground. By year end we had visited the Kilimanjaro Region of Tanzania three times and had brought together all relevant partners to begin to pilot a new project: Empowering Farming Women Through Tourism. Partners include KWIEO, a leading women's empowerment organisation, 20 hotels, SEVIA, a training farm, Mwanga Community Bank, and over seventy farming women. We delivered training on tourism and its opportunities to bring people out of poverty and support their empowerment to partner organisations, hotels and farmers.
- 4. Regrettably, because of the political situation in Turkey, we had to postpone our Walking the Talk conference with village women in Anatolia. Considerable work had been carried out to set up this unique four day conference, where participants were intended to walk between villages discussing presentations given in the morning. We set up a website and invited speakers and participants from across the globe from academia, the tourism industry, consultants, NGOs and community based organisations. The event had been due to take place in October 2016.
- 5. We have carried out training sessions on women's role in tourism to women tourism entrepreneurs at the UK's World Travel Market in November 2016.
- 6. We have continued to attend seminars, workshops, dialogues and conferences both in the UK and abroad, and have focused on enabling international development organisations to understand the role of tourism in development. Countries where we have presented have included Spain, Cape Verde, Nicaragua, Indonesia and Costa Rica.

Equality in Tourism's remit remains focused on forming partnerships.

- 1. Considerable time was allocated to finalising the arrangements with our stakeholders in Turkey for our walking conference. We then had to extract ourselves from the conference and postpone it until the political situation improves. Although we wanted very much to ensure solidarity with our Turkish partners, this proved impossible as people who had signed up to the conference began to pull out. We remain open to mounting the conference again as soon as the situation permits.
- 2. Our Tanzanian project, Empowering Farming Women Through Tourism, could only materialise through a consultative process. Stakeholders now include: farming women from the village of Shiri Njoro, Kilimanjaro Region, KWIECO Women's Empowerment Organisation, hotels, the Sevia Training Farm, the Mwanga Community Bank, The Tanzanian Tourism Authority, The Tanzanian Tourism Board, Responsible Tourism Tanzania, the Tanzanian Government's National Economic Empowerment Council and the UN Commission on Trade and Development.
- 3. Equality in Tourism's global network of Associates has been invited to contribute to the organisation's development.
- 4. New partnerships have been formed in Costa Rica with hotel and tour operator partners when we were invited to contribute to workshops on women's empowerment and tourism.
