The company continued to manage its on-line creative network enabling artists and events organisers to collaborate and co-promote their cultural activities.

The company continued to advise a range of clients including individuals and organisations on the development of cultural activities for their communities also supplying artists and expertise to clients. In the year in question a new partnership was brokered between University of Chichester Conservatoire and Mikron Theatre Company (Yorkshire) to deliver a new theatre commission at The Hawth, Crawley celebrating women's football. This included striking up relationships with the Sussex FA and Brighton & Hove Women FC. A relationship to support the local theatre in Bognor Regis with its local profile prior to redevelopment has been negotiated going forward. Small consultancy contracts maintain the networks pending a planned strategic review in Spring 2023 which will determine the scope and scale of the company's future work and potential for merging with another similar agency to build capacity.

Additional work continues in development with Worthing & Arun theatres at the time of the year end, for delivery in the following financial year.
