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# Directors' Report For the Year Ended 31 December 2019

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2019.

#### Principal activity

The company's principal activity is that of an investment holding company in the care home sector.

#### Results

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £610,995 (2018 -profit £5,553,067).

#### Going concern

During the year the company's subsidiary completed its disposal programme and at the balance sheet date had disposed of all homes. The directors are currently exploring various strategies for both companies' future and there is no intention to strike off the companies in the foreseeable future. However the directors have assessed that the business cannot currently demonstrate that it is a going concern until various future avenues have been fully explored. Accordingly, these financial statements are not prepared on a going concern basis and all assets/liabilities have been restated to their recoverable/payable amounts. The directors consider that the COVID 19 pandemic which arose after the balance sheet date will not have a significant impact on the entity.

# Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 31 December 2019

#### 1. General information

Crossco (1334) Limited is a private company limited by shares and incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act 2006. The address of the registered office is given on the company information page and the nature of the company's operations and its principal activity is set out in the directors' report.

#### 2. Accounting policies

#### 2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with Section 1A of FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies (see note 3).

The presentational and functional currency of these financial statements is GBP. Values are rounded to the nearest pound.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

#### 2.2 Going concern

During the year the company's subsidiary completed its disposal programme and at the balance sheet date had disposed of all homes. The directors are currently exploring various strategies for both companies' future and there is no intention to strike off the companies in the foreseeable future.

However the directors have assessed that the business cannot currently demonstrate that it is a going concern until various future avenues have been fully explored.

Accordingly, these financial statements are not prepared on a going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments as a result of the financial statements being prepared on a basis other than going concern.

The directors consider that the COVID 19 pandemic which arose after the balance sheet date will not have a significant impact on the entity.

#### 2.3 Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

#### 2.4 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours.

#### 2. Accounting policies (continued)

#### 2.5 Financial instruments

The company only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties and investments in ordinary shares.

Financial assets that are measured at cost and amortised cost are assessed at the end of each reporting period for objective evidence of impairment. If objective evidence of impairment is found, an impairment loss is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

#### 2. Accounting policies (continued)

#### 2.6 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

#### 2.7 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to the statement of comprehensive income over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount.

#### 2.8 Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income in the year in which they are incurred.

#### 2.9 Current and deferred taxation

Tax is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the company operates and generates income.

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the statement of financial position date, except that:

- The recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits; and
- Any deferred tax balances are reversed if and when all conditions for retaining associated tax allowances have been met.

Deferred tax balances are not recognised in respect of permanent differences except in respect of business combinations, when deferred tax is recognised on the differences between the fair values of assets acquired and the future tax deductions available for them and the differences between the fair values of liabilities acquired and the amount that will be assessed for tax. Deferred tax is determined using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

#### 2.10 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

#### 3. Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In applying the company's accounting policies, the directors may be required to make judgements and estimates that could impact the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the statement of financial position date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year.

The directors have not been required to use a significant degree of judgement in determining the timing and value of amounts recognised in the financial statements, other than that relating to the valuation of investments in subsidiary undertakings. These are considered for indications of impairment and if required an impairment review will be carried out and decision made on possible impairment. Factors taken into consideration in reaching such a decision include the economic viability and expected future financial performance of the asset.

Bad debts are provided for where objective evidence of the need for a provision exists.

The directors are not aware of any significant sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements.

#### 15. Post balance sheet events

The global pandemic COVID-19 is considered to be a post balance sheet event. However, as the company's subsdiary had completed its disposal programme during 2019 and as it had no remaining homes at the balance sheet date, the directors assess that the pandemic has no material impact on this company's or its subsidiary's financial statements.

#### 16. Ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party

The company's immediate parent undertaking is Butterfly Group Healthcare Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales, which is the smallest and largest group to consolidate these financial statements. The ultimate controlling party of the company is Monarch Master Funding Limited, a company registered in the Cayman Islands.
