Directors Report

for the period ended 31 March 2015

The Directors present their report and the unaudited financial statements for the period ending 31 March 2015

Structure, governance and management

All Good Stuff Community Interest Company (Company number 08763022) was incorporated on 5 k (5 k) November 2013 and its Memorandum and Articles of Association govern it. Its legal status is that of a company limited by guarantee and a Community Interest Company.

Overall management of the company is the responsibility of the directors who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the memorandum and articles of association. Day to day project activity is carried out by paid staff and volunteers.

Principal Activities

All good stuff CIC showcases, promotes and sells the work of artists and makers and one small independent bookseller. All except two are based in/ near South Yorkshire.

We have been doing this in a gallery/shop since May 1st 2014, following incorporation on 5th November 2013 and a search for a suitable venue in Sheffield city centre

We chose a venue which is rented from Freeman College, part of Ruskin Mill Educational Trust. The company benefits the college by providing a reliable, responsible tenancy and selling artefacts produced by its students. Since January 2015 the company has provided a work experience position for a student of Freeman College - a college providing education and training for young people 16-25 with learning difficulties.

The company benefits its primary community of around 50 local artists and makers by providing a beautiful city centre outlet at preferential rates

We have worked with a local university by providing volunteer positions for its student volunteer programme - working in the shop alongside our own seller-volunteers, and providing photographs and films for promotion of the shop and its sellers 5 positions were envisioned, 3 were realised during the academic year. The company also worked with the same university's employability and careers service by advising creative arts students on staging an arts and craft fair - an inaugural event.

We also provide selling space at lower rates for current students and recent graduates

We provide high quality art and craft for sale to all, including the local community

The company took on the tenancy of a second studio space, adjoining the shop, in December 2014 We have been offering art and craft workshops in this new space to the public since January 2015 Opportunities to meet and talk with makers have been offered since we opened the shop

THE COMPANY BENEFITS ITS PRIMARY COMMUNITY OF ARTISTS AND MAKERS BY PROVIDING A BEAUTIFUL CITY CENTRE OUTLET AT PREFERENTIAL RATES.

18 ARTISTS AND MAKERS HAVE JOINED THE ORIGINAL 38 WHO WERE WITH THE COMPANY AT THE START OF TRADING, AND 9 OF THE ORIGINAL 38 HAVE LEFT. SINCE OCTOBER 2014 THE NUMBER HAS BEEN STEADY AT AROUND 50.

THE COMPANY HAS WORKED WITH A LOCAL UNIVERSITY, PROVIDING VOLUNTEER POSITIONS FOR ITS STUDENT VOLUNTEER PROGRAMME - WORKING IN THE SHOP ALONGSIDE OUR OWN SELLER-VOLUNTEERS, AND PROVIDING PHOTOGRAPHS AND FILMS FOR PROMOTION OF THE SHOP AND ITS SELLERS. 5 POSITIONS WERE ENVISIONED, 3 WERE REALISED DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR. THE COMPANY ALSO WORKED WITH THE SAME UNIVERSITY'S EMPLOYABILITY AND CAREERS SERVICE BY ADVISING CREATIVE ARTS STUDENTS ON STAGING AN ARTS AND CRAFT FAIR - AN INAUGURAL EVENT.

THE COMPANY ALSO PROVIDES SELLING SPACE AT LOWER RATES FOR CURRENT STUDENTS AND RECENT GRADUATES.

THE COMPANY PROVIDED ALL OF ITS INTERESTED ARTISTS AND MAKERS WITH LOW-COST SPACE AT SHEFFIELD'S PREMIER ART AND CRAFT EVENT - 'ART IN THE GARDENS' - IN SEPTEMBER 2014. 20 OR SO ARTISTS AND MAKERS WHO CANNOT NORMALLY AFFORD THE COSTS INVOLVED, WERE ENABLED TO PARTICIPATE. THE COMPANY'S STAND WAS AWARDED 'BEST STAND IN SHOW'.

THE COMPANY PROVIDES HIGH QUALITY ART AND CRAFT FOR SALE TO ALL, INCLUDING THE LOCAL COMMUNITY.
