### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

The Directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements of Advanced Medical Solutions (Europe) Limited (the "Company") for the year ended 31 December 2020. The Directors' Report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions relating to small companies under section 417(1) of the Companies Act 2006.

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101-Reduced Disclosure Framework (FRS 101). The Company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions allowed under this standard. The Company has also taken advantage of the exemption from presenting a Strategic Report.

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the Company is as an investment company, holding an investment in another group company. The Company's functional and presentational currency is Euros.

### RESULTS, OUTLOOK AND DIVIDENDS

The results for the year and the Company's financial position at the end of the year are shown in the subsequent financial statements. Net assets were €60,060,592 at 31 December 2020 (2019: €59,722,793) and the profit for the year ended 31 December 2020 was €1,911,132 (2019: €1,903,868), arising predominantly from finance income received.

The Directors anticipate the performance and results of the Company to continue at current levels in the future.

During the year the Company paid dividends of €1,573,333 (2019: €1,567,163). Post year end, the Company has paid €1,176,767 in dividends.

#### **GOING CONCERN**

In carrying out their duties in respect of going concern, the Directors have carried out a review of the Company's financial position and cash flow forecasts for the next 12 months from signing of the financial statements. These have been based on a comprehensive review of revenue, expenditure and cash flows, taking into account specific business risks and the current economic environment.

The Directors consider the Company has sufficient financial resources and it is well placed to manage its business risks successfully. The Company is profitable and has net current assets. After making enquiries and considering the COVID-19 impact on forecasts in assessing the going concern assumption the directors have relied upon a letter of support from Advanced Medical Solutions Group plc (see note 11). The directors have a made appropriate enquiries to confirm that Advanced Medical Solutions Group plc has adequate resources to provide the financial commitment contained in the letter of support and to continue in operational existence for at least 12 months from the date of the approval of the financial statements. Accordingly, the Company continues to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Advanced Medical Solutions Group PLC "the Group" which had cash and cash equivalents at the same year end of £53.8 million (2019: £64.8 million) and had no borrowings (2019: minimal debt). The Group has an undrawn five-year, £80 million, multi-currency, revolving credit facility in place until December 2023 with an accordion option under which it can request up to an additional £20 million on the same terms. The facility is provided jointly by the Group's existing bank HSBC, as well as The Royal Bank of Scotland PLC. It is unsecured on the assets of the Group and is currently undrawn.

While the current economic environment is uncertain, in particular in relation to COVID-19, the Group operates in a market whose demographics are favourable, underpinned by an increasing need for surgical procedures and chronic wound treatment. Consequently, market growth is predicted for the medium-term once the impact of COVID-19 subsides. The Group has a number of long-term contracts with customers across different geographic regions and also with substantial financial resources, ranging from government agencies through to global healthcare companies. The Company has also considered the implications that may arise as a result of the Brexit transition period and developed appropriate risk management solutions to mitigate this risk.

# DIRECTORS' REPORT (CONTINUED) GOING CONCERN (continued)

Having taken the above into consideration, the Directors have reached the conclusion that the Company is well placed to manage its business risks in the current economic environment. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Interest rate risk and credit risk

The Company has interest-bearing assets. The interest-bearing assets earn interest at fixed rates. Loans made by the Company are exposed to the credit risk of the counterparty. All counterparties are other companies within the Advanced Medical Solutions Group. The credit risk and all other risks are managed by the Group.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the year ended 31 December 2020

#### 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Advanced Medical Solutions (Europe) Limited is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales and incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Companies Act 2006. The address of the registered office is given on page 1. The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary and is included within the consolidated financial statements of Advanced Medical Solutions Group plc. The registered address of the parent Company providing consolidated financial statements is Premier Park, 33 Road One, Winsford Industrial Estate, Winsford, Cheshire, CW7 3RT.

### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of accounting**

The Company meets the definition of a qualifying entity under FRS 100 'Application of Financial Reporting Requirements' issued by the Financial Reporting Council. Accordingly these financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework'.

As permitted by FRS 101, the Company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions available under that standard in relation to presentation of an opening statement of financial position at the date of transition, presentation of a cash flow statement, standards not yet effective, related party transactions and financial instruments.

Where relevant, equivalent disclosures have been given in the group accounts of Advanced Medical Solutions Group plc. The group accounts of Advanced Medical Solutions Group plc are available to the public and can be obtained as set out in note 11.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are presented in Euros, which is the functional currency of the Company. The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

### Going concern

As shown in the statement of financial position the Company has net assets of €60,060,592 (2019: €59,722,793). The Company's forecasts and projections, taking account of reasonably possible changes in the trading performance of the entities within which the Company's credit risk resides within, show that the Company should be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due.

Taking the above into account, the Directors have formed a judgement that, at the time of approving the financial statements, and having considered the Company's forecasts and projections, there is a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future, despite the impact of COVID-19. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, sensitivity analysis has been prepared to stress test forecasts and the Directors are confident the business can withstand the challenges.

All Group sites are currently in operation and meeting commitments to maintain supply of its medical devices to healthcare partners and customers worldwide. While the current economic environment is uncertain, in particular in relation to COVID-19, the Company operates as part of a Group whose markets demographics are favourable, underpinned by an increasing need for products to treat chronic and acute wounds. Consequently, market growth is predicted for the medium term once the impact of COVID-19 subsides.

Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

### Taxation

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. The Company's liability for current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the year ended 31 December 2020

### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### Recognition and valuation of financial assets

### Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised in the Company's Statement of financial position when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets are derecognised when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire or are transferred. Financial liabilities are derecognised when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at the bank and in hand and are subject to insignificant risk in change in value.

Trade and other receivables

Trade receivables are stated initially at fair value and subsequent to initial recognition they are measured at amortised cost including a provision for expected credit losses. The Company measures the provision at an amount equal to lifetime expected credit losses estimated by reference to past experience and relevant forward-looking factors. The Company writes off a trade receivable when there is objective evidence that the debtor is in significant financial difficulty and there is no realistic prospect of recovery, for example, when a debtor enters bankruptcy or financial reorganisation.

Trade payables

Trade payables are initially recognised at fair value and are subsequently recognised at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

### Prior year adjustment

Following review, it was identified that amounts owed by Group undertakings of €59,000,000 (2019: €59,000,000) had previously been presented within current assets, but should have been presented within non-current assets. Although amounts were repayable on demand, they were intended for use on a continuing basis and therefore did not meet the criteria to be classified as current assets. The prior period financial statements have been restated to show these balances within non-current assets, as shown in Note 8.

### Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

Given the nature of the Company the Directors do not consider there to be any critical accounting judgements or key sources of estimation uncertainty.

### 3. DIRECTORS' EMOLUMENTS

No Director received any emoluments for their services to the Company (2019: €nil).

### 4. EMPLOYEE INFORMATION

The Company had no employees during the year or the previous year and as a result incurred no employee costs.

### 5. OPERATING PROFIT

The auditor's remuneration for the audit of these financial statements of  $\in 2,032$  (2019:  $\in 2,032$ ) was borne by a fellow Group undertaking. There were no non-audit fees in the year (2019:  $\in$ nil).
