STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

Introduction

The principal activity of the Company is a holding company.

The principal activity of the Group is the marketing, designs, manufacture, and installation of bespoke luxury fitted products for the home and engages with customers online with a focused digital marketing approach through its nationwide estate of showrooms and also through home sales visits.

Business review

Bespoke Home Interior Design Limited (the "Company") is part of the wider BHID Group Limited Group (the "Group"). The Company and Group had a challenging year due to an unprecedented set of economic and social circumstances impacting on the UK. The Group experienced inconsistent demand and reduced levels of consumer confidence caused by factors such as high inflation, cost of living pressures, instability in the UK Government and the war in Ukraine.

Despite these disruptions the Group experienced strong demand for its products, with Order Intake being over 25% greater than the pre-Covid FY19 period. This has been aided by the shift in digital adoption, together with our focused digital marketing strategy. We are generating higher quality client leads that are also more cost effective. This digital first marketing approach is a significant barrier for smaller competitors in reaching the scale to compete with the Group's brands.

In addition to the demand headwinds experienced, the Group faced significant supply-side headwinds, namely significant commodity and general inflation, and labour supply shortages.

Inflation has been of particular significance across the cost base and especially in manufacturing materials and wages.

Positively, towards the end of FY23 a number of supply-side headwinds, namely commodity inflation, were starting to ease. This softening of materials input costs has continued post year end.

DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the Strategic Report and Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law, including FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs and profit or loss of the Company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards in conformity with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Going concern

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company and the Group have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future, being a period of not less than 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements.

In their consideration of going concern, the directors have reviewed the Group's future cash flow forecasts and profit projections for the period to 30 April 2025, on both a base case and certain sensitised basis, considering the principal risks and uncertainties of the Group.

These forecasts have been prepared based on past experience, the outstanding order book, marketing data and KPI's, market data and expected trading, and they reflect any potential impact of wider market headwinds on trading activity and liquidity. The directors have reviewed these forecasts and have also considered sensitivities in respect of potential downside scenarios and the mitigating actions available to the Group.

Under all scenarios, there was sufficient headroom on covenants and cash headroom. Accordingly, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

Qualifying third party indemnity provisions

The Company insures against third party indemnity risks through its Directors' and Officers' (D&O) liability insurance policy.

Post balance sheet events

There have been no significant events affecting the Company post year end.

Matters covered in the Strategic Report

The business review, analysis of key performance indicators and assessment of financial risk management is included within the Strategic Report.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

1. Company information

Bespoke Home Interior Design Limited is a limited liability company incorporated in the UK, and its registered office is Broadoak Business Park, Ashburton Road West, Trafford Park, Manchester, M17 1RW.

The principal activity is that of a holding company.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 3).

The Company's financial statements are presented in Sterling and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand (£000) except when otherwise stated.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Consolidation exemption

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 not to prepare consolidated financial statements. The financial statements present information about the Company as an individual entity and not about its group.

2.3 Financial Reporting Standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The Company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by the FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland":

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirements of Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d); and
- the requirements of Section 33 Related Party Disclosures paragraph 33.7.

This information is included in the consolidated financial statements of BHID Group Limited as at 30 April 2023 and these financial statements may be obtained from Companies House.

2.4 Going concern

2.5 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

2.6 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment.

2.7 Financial instruments

The Company only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties and investments in ordinary shares.

Financial assets that are measured at cost and amortised cost are assessed at the end of each reporting period for objective evidence of impairment. If objective evidence of impairment is found, an impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

For financial assets measured at amortised cost, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. If a financial asset has a variable interest rate, the discount rate for measuring any impairment loss is the current effective interest rate determined under the contract.

For financial assets measured at cost less impairment, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and best estimate of the recoverable amount, which is an approximation of the amount that the Company would receive for the asset if it were to be sold at the reporting date.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount reported in the Statement of Financial Position when there is an enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.8 Creditors

Short-term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.9 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to the Statement of Comprehensive Income over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

2.10 Dividends

Equity dividends are recognised when they become legally payable. Interim equity dividends are recognised when paid. Final equity dividends are recognised when approved by the shareholders at an annual general meeting.

2.11 Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income for the year in which they are incurred.

2.12 Current and deferred taxation

Tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the reporting date, except that:

- The recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits; and
- Any deferred tax balances are reversed if and when all conditions for retaining associated tax allowances have been met.

Deferred tax balances are not recognised in respect of permanent differences except in respect of business combinations, when deferred tax is recognised on the differences between the fair values of assets acquired and the future tax deductions available for them and the differences between the fair values of liabilities acquired and the amount that will be assessed for tax. Deferred tax is determined using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

2.13 Dividend income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

2.14 Distributions to equity holders

Dividends and other distributions to the Group's shareholders are recognised as a liability in the financial statements in the period in which the dividends and other distributions are approved by the shareholders. These amounts are recognised in the Statement of changes in equity.

Management consider there to be no key judgements in the application of accounting policies or key sources of estimation uncertainty.

Factors that may affect future tax charges

An increase in the future main corporation tax rate to 25% from 1 April 2023, from the previously enacted 19%, was announced in the budget on 3 March 2021, and substantively enacted on 24 May 2021.
