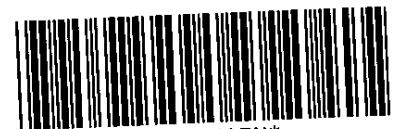

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

International Mixed Ability Sports CIC is a private company, limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially measured at cost. After initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Computer software is being amortised evenly over its estimated useful life of three years.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Short leasehold	- in accordance with the property
Fixtures and fittings	- 20% on cost
Motor vehicles	- 25% on cost

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

International Mixed Ability Sports CIC (IMAS) promotes an innovative approach to social inclusion through sport and education. Mixed Ability involves participants of all abilities or facing wider barriers to participation, in the same mainstream, non-adapted sport activities, generating social inclusion and improving health, confidence and social skills.

IMAS continues to run weekly educational classes to train Mixed Ability ambassadors and co-produce resources to promote the Mixed Ability Model.

IMAS utilised the second 2-year of funding from Sport England to create thirteen new Mixed Ability Activities in the Bradford District and deliver presentations and open days/activities in Liverpool, York, Leeds and locations in South Yorkshire.

The IMAS partnership with England Rugby to promote Mixed Ability Rugby into community rugby clubs continues nationally and in 2018 is predicted to have a wider impact on grassroots rugby clubs in the Midlands thanks to support from Comic Relief funding.

IMAS has begun to introduce Mixed Ability Rugby and Cricket into mainstream and special educational needs schools offering pupils a pathway into local clubs and teams.

The wider impact of Mixed Ability Sports is being evaluated by University Departments at Leeds (Centre for Disability Studies) and Loughborough.

The 2nd IMAS organised International Mixed Ability Rugby Tournament (IMART 2017), was held in August in Vitoria-Gasteiz, Spain. 12 participating teams from across the World competed over five days flying the flag for equal participation and taking the Mixed Ability model back to their respective countries.

IMAS created the Mixed Ability Manifesto which is being shared widely across disability organisations and sports governing bodies globally.

The two IMAS Directors Mark Goodwin, Martino Corazza appointed Dr Mark Julian Purvis, Mr Roy Smith and Mr Hugh Brown in September 2017 as Non-executive Directors. The directors hold regular meetings.

IMAS is currently re-structuring it's advisory board to reflect the diverse communities it seeks to serve.

IMAS continues to work with Sports NGB's, Disability and Disability Rights organisations, County Sports Partnerships, Universities and Health Support Services.
