Receipts and Payments

What work has been done in the period of this report, why was that work necessary and what has been the financial benefit (if any) to creditors?

Details of the types of work that generally fall into the headings mentioned below are available on our firm's website - http://www.begbies-traynorgroup.com/work-details Under the following headings we have explained the specific work that has been undertaken on this case. Not every piece of work has been described, but we have sought to give a proportionate overview which provides sufficient detail to allow creditors to understand what has been done, why it was necessary and what financial benefit (if any) the work has provided to creditors.

The costs incurred in relation to each heading are set out in the Time Costs Analysis which is attached at Appendix 2. There is an analysis for the period of the report and also an analysis of time spent on the case since the date of our appointment. The details below relate to the work undertaken in the period of the report only. Our previous report contains details of the work undertaken since our appointment.

General case administration and planning

The joint administrators have formulated an appropriate strategy and monitored and reviewed that strategy, including meetings with internal and external independent advisors to consider practical, technical and legal aspects of the case.

Time has been spent in populating and maintaining electronic case files and complying with internal filing and information recording practices. We have also spent time updating internal checklists and completing periodic case reviews.

Whilst this does not benefit creditors financially, it is necessary to ensure the efficient and compliant progressing of the administration, which ensures that the joint administrators and their staff carry out their work to high professional standards.

Compliance with the Insolvency Act, Rules and best practice

During the period of this report, we have prepared and issued to all relevant parties our six monthly progress report in order to provide an update to the creditors of the progress made during the first six months of the administration. This report was filed at Companies House in order to meet statutory requirements.

Our cashier has spent time in reconciling the bank account and processing receipts and payments within the period.

Time has been spent in dealing with the extension of the administration, which included providing the notice of extension to the creditors and Companies House.

Whilst this work is of no direct financial benefit to creditors it is necessary in accordance with the Act, Rules and best practice.

Realisation of assets

Licence to occupy

In accordance with the terms of the licence to occupy, Bierkeller Birmingham Limited ("BBL") has paid a licence fee two weeks in advance covering all property cost. The sums paid have been in accordance with the sublease in place.

During the period of this report, we have received the sum of £113,267 in respect of property costs which includes property insurance, rent and rates. We have discharged to the landlord all sums accrued in relation to rent and property insurance totalling £68,076. This has been paid in accordance with the head lease.

As detailed in our last progress report, the licence to occupy was extended until 19 September 2019 to enable BBL to complete an assignment of the lease and BBL paid a licence fee of £100,000.

BBL has also paid a lease premium of £50,000 and the assignment of the lease completed on 20 September 2019.

The sum of £62,214 has been paid to Nottingham City Council in respect of business rates for the period from 20 December 2018 to 20 September 2019.

,

We have paid the sum of £500 plus VAT to Gosschalks Solicitors in respect of their fees incurred in dealing with the extension of the licence to occupy. The sum of £1,800 was paid by BBL as a contribution to our legal fees.

It was necessary to spend more time as previously envisaged in dealing with the extension to the licence to occupy and the assignment of the lease. Time was spent in having to chase the tenant to complete the assignment and further time to liaise with the landlord and solicitors in this respect

Other matters which includes seeking decisions of creditors via deemed consent procedure and/or decision procedures, meetings, tax, litigation, pensions and travel

Time has been spent in dealing with the review of the VAT and corporation tax returns in respect of the administration period.

Whilst this does not benefit creditors financially, it is necessary in accordance with statutory requirements and best practice

ESTIMATED OUTCOME FOR CREDITORS

Details of the sums owed to each class of the Company's creditors were provided in our statement of proposals.

On the basis of realisations we estimate an outcome for each class of the Company's creditors as follows:

Secured creditor

As a consequence of the Deed of Novation entered into by the Company (and other Burningnight subsidiary companies), resulting in its release and discharge from its obligations and liabilities to pay the debt outstanding to AIF 1 Ltd, there is nothing outstanding to the secured creditor.

Preferential creditors

There are no known preferential creditors.

Prescribed Part for unsecured creditors pursuant to Section 176A of the Act

As a consequence of the Deed of Novation entered into by the Company, there is no debt outstanding in relation to any floating charges created or registered on or after 15 September 2003, and consequently there is no prescribed part.

Unsecured creditors

There will be insufficient funds available to enable a dividend to be paid to the unsecured creditors after defraying costs associated with the administration.

Effect of administration on limitation periods under the Limitation Act 1980

As we have previously confirmed, the Limitation Act 1980 continues to apply to all debts due from the Company. Case law indicates that where a company is in administration, time does not stop running for limitation purposes pursuant to the Limitation Act 1980. If you have any concerns in relation to your claim against the Company becoming time-barred during the course of the administration, we strongly recommend that you seek independent legal advice on the options available to you to prevent this.

REMUNERATION & DISBURSEMENTS

Our remuneration has been fixed by reference to the time properly given by us and the various grades of our staff calculated at the prevailing hourly charge out rates of Begbies Traynor (Central) LLP and O'Haras Limited in attending to matters as set out in the fees estimate dated 29 January 2019.

We are also authorised to draw disbursements for services provided by our firms and/or entities within the Begbies Traynor group, in accordance with our firm's policy, details of which accompanied the Statement of proposals for achieving the purpose of administration and which are attached at Appendix 2 of this report.

Begbies Traynor (Central) LLP's time costs for the period from 7 June 2019 to 6 December 2019 amount to £25,967 which represents 71 hours at an average rate of £366 per hour.

O'Haras Limited's time costs for the period from 7 June 2019 to 6 December 2019 amount to £15,303 which represents 52 hours at an average rate of £293 per hour.

Further information in relation to our time costs is set out at Appendix 2 and provides details of the work undertaken by us and our staff following our appointment only.

To 6 December 2019, neither Begbies Traynor (Central) LLP or O'Haras Limited have drawn any funds on account of our remuneration, against total time costs of £51,178 and £23,033,incurred respectively since the date of our appointment.

Time Costs Analysis

In addition to the time costs information disclosed at Appendix 2 for the period of this report, a cumulative Time Costs Analysis for the period from 7 December 2018 to 6 December 2019 is also attached at Appendix 2.

As can be seen from the information above, we have exceeded the limit of our previously approved estimate. The reasons why the previously approved estimate has been exceeded are as follows:

- We have undertaken additional work not envisaged at the time the fees estimate was prepared. The
 amount of time spent in correspondence with the landlord and the tenant in relation to the licence to
 occupy and the assignment of the lease is significantly higher than that originally envisaged.
- Additional time has been spent in reviewing, negotiating and completing the variation of the original sale agreement entered into on 20 December 2018 by way of a Deed
- As a consequence of the licence to occupy being extended, further time has been spent in liaising with the tenant and landlord and discharging property costs.
- It was also necessary to seek an extension of the administration for a period of 12 months by way of a creditors' decision.
- Due to the complexity of the administration and the significant number of matters which we have been
 required to deal with on an ongoing basis, the time spent on general case administration and planning
 is significantly higher than originally estimated. In particular extensive investigations have been
 undertaken as previously advised. Given the complex nature of the investigations it has been
 necessary for the work required to be undertaken by senior members of staff who have the experience,
 expertise and necessary competencies required to carry out the work.

In light of the above, we are obliged to provide creditors with details of the additional work that has been undertaken along with details of the time and cost of that additional work. This information appears at Appendix We do not anticipate that we will need to seek further approval following the proposed increase to our estimate.

We are seeking creditors' approval of our further estimate via a decision procedure by way of correspondence. The documentation which we require creditors to complete and return has been sent separately.

Disbursements

To 6 December 2019, we have also incurred disbursements in the sum of £463.

Evans Law

Evans Law have been instructed to assist the administrators with the assignment of the Company's interest in the lease and subsequent assignment of the lease. Their fees incurred in dealing with this matter are estimated at £3,725.

As previously advised, our solicitors' fees have exceeded the estimate. This is due to the complex matters that have been identified as requiring legal advice and the Company being jointly and severally liable. There are insufficient realisations to enable solicitor's fees to be discharged in full by the Company.

Expenses actually incurred compared to those that were anticipated

Creditors will recall that we estimated that the expenses of the administration would total £180,207. Unfortunately, we consider that, in addition to those already incurred, the expenses which we are likely to incur to the conclusion of the case will exceed our original estimate. The reasons why the estimate has been exceeded are as follows.

- As detailed above, solicitor's fees have exceeded the estimate and the Company is jointly and severally liable for those expenses;
- It was necessary to incur further agent's fees in order to ensure that the property was secure,
- Accountant's fees will also be incurred as it will be necessary to instruct accountants to assist us with the corporation tax returns for the administration period.

8. ASSETS THAT REMAIN TO BE REALISED AND WORK THAT REMAINS TO BE DONE

What work remains to be done, why is this necessary and what financial benefit (if any) will it provide to creditors?

General case administration and planning

Time will be spent in carrying out compliance reviews, internal checklist updates, periodic case reviews and maintaining case files.

Whilst this work will not benefit creditors financially, it is necessary to ensure efficient progress of the case and is required in accordance with best practice.

Compliance with the Insolvency Act, Rules and best practice

We are required to draft and issue interim progress reports on a six monthly basis to provide an update to the creditors of the progress made during the administration. These documents will be filed at Companies House to meet statutory requirements.

In addition, a final progress report will have to be produced when the administration has reached its conclusion. This will provide creditors with an overview of the administration, including all realisations, costs and the final outcome for creditors.

Whilst many of these tasks do not have a direct benefit in enhancing realisations for the insolvent estate, they assist in the efficient and compliant progressing of the administration. They are also necessary in accordance with the Act, Rules and best practice.

Investigations

We have carried out detailed investigations into the Company's affairs and we are now in the process of fully considering the outcome of such investigations with our solicitors and the creditors to determine what, if any, further actions are to be taken.

Other matters which includes seeking decisions of creditors via the deemed consent procedure and/or decision procedures, meetings, tax, litigation, pensions and travel

In accordance with statute and best practice we will ensure submission of VAT and corporation tax returns to HMRC in respect of the administration period. We will instruct accountants where necessary to deal with the returns on our behalf.

Whilst the above work will not benefit creditors financially, it is necessary in accordance with statutory requirements and best practice

How much will this further work cost?

We estimate that the costs of the future work to be carried out as detailed above will be approximately £5,000.

Expenses

Details of the expenses that we expect to incur in connection with the work that remains to be done referred to above are as set out in the revised estimate of anticipated expenses attached at Appendix 3

OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

Report on Directors conduct

As detailed in our statement of proposals, we have a duty to submit a report to the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy on the conduct of the directors We have complied with our duties in this respect.

Investigations completed

As explained in our Statement of Proposals, we have undertaken an initial assessment of the manner in which the business was conducted prior to the administration of the Company and potential recoveries for the estate in this respect

We have carried out detailed investigations into the conduct of the Company and its financial affairs. These investigations have included a forensic analysis of the Company's bank statements and review of the Company's books and records both electronic and hard copy.

We are currently considering whether to pursue any claims identified in this matter taking into consideration the likelihood of success, lack of funds with which to pursue any claims and the considerable costs that may be incurred.

Extension of administration

The administration has been extended for a period of 12 months by order of the court.

BEGBIES TRAYNOR CHARGING POLICY

INTRODUCTION

This note applies where a licensed insolvency practitioner in the firm is acting as an office holder of an insolvent estate and seeks creditor approval to draw remuneration on the basis of the time properly spent in dealing with the case. It also applies where further information is to be provided to creditors regarding the office holder's fees following the passing of a resolution for the office holder to be remunerated on a time cost basis. Best practice guidance¹ requires that such information should be disclosed to those who are responsible for approving remuneration.

In addition, this note applies where creditor approval is sought to make a separate charge by way of expenses or disbursements to recover the cost of facilities provided by the firm. It also applies where payments are to be made to parties other than the firm, but in relation to which the office holder, the firm or any associate has an interest. Best practice guidance² indicates that such charges should be disclosed to those who are responsible for approving the office holder's remuneration, together with an explanation of how those charges are calculated.

OFFICE HOLDER'S FEES IN RESPECT OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF INSOLVENT ESTATES

The office holder has overall responsibility for the administration of the estate. He/she will delegate tasks to members of staff. Such delegation assists the office holder as it allows him/her to deal with the more complex aspects of the case and ensures that work is being carried out at the appropriate level. There are various levels of staff that are employed by the office holder and these appear below.

The firm operates a time recording system which allows staff working on the case along with the office holder to allocate their time to the case. The time is recorded at the individual's hourly rate in force at that time which is detailed below.

EXPENSES INCURRED BY OFFICE HOLDERS IN RESPECT OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF INSOLVENT ESTATES

Best practice guidance classifies expenses into two broad categories:

- Category 1 disbursements (approval not required) specific expenditure that is directly related to the case and referable to an independent external supplier's invoice. All such items are charged to the case as they are incurred.
- Category 2 disbursements (approval required) items of expenditure that are directly related to the case which include an element of shared or allocated cost and are based on a reasonable method of calculation, but which are not payable to an independent third party.
 - (A) The following items of expenditure are charged to the case (subject to approval):
 - Internal meeting room usage for the purpose of statutory meetings of creditors is charged at the rate of £100 (London £150) per meeting;
 - Car mileage is charged at the rate of 45 pence per mile;
 - Storage of books and records (when not chargeable as a Category 1 disbursement) is charged
 on the basis that the number of standard archive boxes held in storage for a particular case
 bears to the total of all archive boxes for all cases in respect of the period for which the storage
 charge relates;

Expenses which should be treated as Category 2 disbursements (approval required) – in addition to the two categories referred to above, best practice guidance indicates that where payments are to be made to outside parties in which the office holder or his firm or any associate has an interest, these should be treated as Category 2 disbursements.

Services provided by other entities within the Begbies Traynor group

The following items of expenditure which relate to services provided by entities within the Begbies Traynor Group, of which the office holder's firm is a member, are also to be charged to the case (subject to approval):

It may become necessary to instruct Eddisons Commercial Limited to provide assistance in valuing the assets of the Company and provide any additional services, not currently anticipated, during the course of the case. In such circumstances and to avoid the costs associated with seeking further approval, the charges for such services will be calculated on a time costs basis at the prevailing hourly rates for their various grades of staff which are currently as follows:

- (8) The following items of expenditure will normally be treated as general office overheads and will not be charged to the case although a charge may be made where the precise cost to the case can be determined because the item satisfies the test of a Category 1 disbursement:
 - Telephone and facsimile
 - · Printing and photocopying
 - Stationery

Additional payments received by Eddisons Commercial Limited from purchasers where assets are disposed of by way of auction

In addition to the charges of Eddisons Commercial Limited detailed above for providing the services to the office holder, where any machinery and business assets (other than freehold/leasehold property) are disposed of by way of auction, Eddisons Commercial Limited will also receive a payment from the purchaser, known as a buyer's premium, equivalent to 15% of the successful bid. Where any freehold/leasehold property is disposed of by way of auction, Eddisons Commercial Limited will also receive a payment from the purchaser, known as a buyer's administration fee, in the sum of £600. It is standard auction industry practice for a buyer's premium and buyer's administration fee to be charged. The buyer's premium and buyer's administration fee is paid by the purchaser of the assets and is not paid by the office holder from the assets of the estate.

BEGBIES TRAYNOR CHARGE-OUT RATES

Time is recorded in 6 minute units.

The office holder may use the services of BTG Forensic during the course of the case. BTG Forensic is a specialist department of the office holder's firm which provides forensic accounting services. The current charge-out rates applying to work carried out by BTG Forensic are as follows:

When charging fees on a time cost basis we use charge out rates appropriate for the skills and experience of a member of staff and the work that they perform. This is combined with the amount of time that they work on each case, recorded in 6 minute units with supporting narrative to explain the work undertaken.

These charge out rates are reviewed on 1 January each year and are adjusted to take account of inflation and the firm's overheads.

Disbursements

In accordance with Statement of Insolvency Practice 9 (SIP 9) the basis of disbursement allocation in respect of disbursements incurred by the Office Holder in connection with the administration of the estate must be fully disclosed to creditors. Disbursements are categorised as either Category 1 or Category 2.

Category 1 expenses are directly referable to an invoice from a third party, which is either in the name of the estate or O'Haras Limited; in the case of the latter, the invoices makes a reference to, and therefore can be directly attributed to, the estate. These disbursements are recoverable in full from the estate without the prior approval of creditors, either by a direct payment from the estate or where the firm has made payment on behalf of the estate, by a recharge of the amount invoiced by the third party. Examples of Category 1 disbursements are statutory advertising, external meeting room hire, external storage and archiving costs, specific bond insurance, Company search fees, postage, travel expenses and photocopying (where a third party is used).

Category 2 expenses are incurred by the firm and recharged to the estate; they are not attributed to the estate by a third party invoice and/or they may include a profit element. These disbursements are recoverable in full from the estate, subject to the bases of the disbursement charge being approved by creditors in advance. Examples of Category 2 disbursements are photocopying (internal), internal room hire, internal storage and mileage.
