Stoneham Bakehouse has run baking sessions throughout this financial year, with a particular emphasis on promoting and supporting the wellbeing of the community. During the financial year 2015-2016, the Bakehouse's activities have benefited the community in the following ways.

- local residents of the Poets' Corner area have been able to buy locally produced bread through a order and collection service
- 20+ members of the local community have been volunteer bakers, producing the bread we sell at the local community café (The Hive CIC), as well as Farmers' Markets. The bakers volunteer for a number of reasons, from supporting their own mental health, to being part of a community group.
- Approximately 30 adults have taken part in baking workshops with an emphasis on wellbeing. These included working with potentially isolated men over 50, women over 50, and a food bank.
- 20 children from a local preschool took part in baking sessions, with an emphasis on healthy eating
- Through funding from the Brighton & Hove CCG, 40 vulnerable children from the local Junior School have taken part in a 6 week program of baking for wellbeing, using the therapeutic nature of working with dough to support their wellbeing
