PART 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT

Stoneham Bakehouse has seen considerable developments throughout this financial year, with a main emphasis on the establishment of our first bakery. During the financial year 2016-2017, the Bakehouse's activities have benefited the community in the following ways:

- With the advent of our bakery on Stoneham Road (opened start May 17)
 local residents of the Poets' Corner area have not only been able to buy
 locally produced bread through a order and collection service, but have the
 promise of a much needed regular bread shop in the heart of the community.
- 25+ members of the local community have been volunteer bakers, producing
 the bread we sell at the local community café (The Hive CIC), as well as
 Farmers' Markets. The bakers volunteer for a number of reasons, from
 supporting their own mental health, to being part of a community group. This
 volunteer group was increased in the latter part of this period as local people
 volunteered to refurb the bakehouse on Stoneham Road.
- Approximately 90 adults have taken part in baking workshops with an emphasis on wellbeing. These included working with Employment Support Allowance claimants, women who have suffered from domestic violence, and older people at risk of isolation.
- 18 children from a local preschool took part in baking sessions, with an emphasis on healthy eating.
- Through continued funding from the Brighton & Hove CCG, 24 vulnerable children from the local Junior School have taken part in a 6 week program of baking for wellbeing; using the therapeutic nature of working with dough to support their wellbeing.
- We've run 12 breadmkaing workshops for paying members of the community; teaching 68 people how to bake a variety of breads.

We constantly take on board what members of the community want from the Bakehouse. At each major step for the Bakehouse we ask the community, through online surveys, questions at Farmers' Markets, and articles in local magazines.

Our taking on of the bakehouse on Stoneham Road was funded from a highly successful Crowdfunding campaign, with most of the pledges coming from the local community. This 'ownership' of the bakehouse has meant the community feel they have a stake in the business and will make suggestions to groups we could work with, or new projects we could be involved in. As a business we take these on board, and are planning a number of activities for 2018 which are in direct response to suggestions.
