### PART 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE COMPANY'S ACTIVITIES AND IMPACT

Stoneham Bakehouse has continued to establish itself as a place to buy and learn to bake bread in the heart of the Poets' Corner community, but over the last 12 months has increased its focus on supporting wellbeing using breadmaking as a therapeutic tool. During the financial year 2018-19, the Bakehouse's activities have benefited the community in the following ways:

- During the year Paula has become a regular paid member of the team, running bakes, and being instrumental in the success of the Bread Shed project. From initially volunteering a few years ago, she's making breadmaking in the community into a career.
- 31 members of the community have been active as volunteer bakers, putting
  in over 3500 hours of baking between them. This has helped us to produce
  over 10000 loaves, 5000 bagels and more than 12000 buns. Our bread
  continued to be sold direct from the Bakehouse, but also in a couple of local
  cafes. In addition, fellow community organisation Plot 22 has been using our
  bread at their allotment sessions.
- We continue to work with organisations and groups to use baking to nourish the community. Over the year approximately 150 people have attended workshops with an emphasis on wellbeing, with older people, unemployed, LGBTQ, and vulnerable children all benefitting.
- Our Bread Shed group, supporting older people at risk of isolation has been a great success, and with continued funding from Sussex Community Foundation and the Healthy Neighbourhood Fund, we've worked with 25 people through the year to make connections and bring people together.
- We've continued to use some of the surplus of sales of workshops and bread sales to finance some PlayDough groups with the local Junior school and subsidise work with local school for children outside mainstream education, Sussex Beacon, and other community groups
- The end of the financial year impacted us, with the Bakehouse ceasing operations in the bakery for the last month of the financial year due to Covid-19. During this initial period of lockdown we did maintain our links with the BreadShed group through WhatsApp, email, and the start of a project to enable participants to bake in their own home. We also supported the local community when it wasn't easy to get hold of flour, bagging and selling over 1300kg of flour during the month of April.
