The principal activity of the company is a community supported agriculture scheme which benefits 130 local households by providing weekly boxes of freshly harvested seasonal vegetable produce direct from the growers to consumers. Any excess or uncollected produce is donated to local charities and food banks. We farm using organic, regenerative methods to protect the natural environment.

We bring wider community benefits by welcoming volunteers each week, holding community events and working closely with other community growing projects in and around Swansea.

We deliver a Sustainable Schools Education Programme working with inner-city Swansea primary schools bringing children to visit our farm, growing produce in school grounds, learning how to make dough and cook pizzas with healthy veg toppings. We also offer a Grow From Home project for families connected to the primary schools providing equipment, training and support to start growing produce at home.

We hold open volunteer sessions twice weekly, you do not have to be a CSA member to attend. Anyone from the local community can attend on a regular or ad hoc basis, all ages and abilities are welcomed. Volunteers are encouraged to have a say in how the sessions are run.

We liaise with primary schools and families to develop the Sustainable Schools and Grow from Home projects we run. These projects have evolved over past years using feedback from schools and families to ensure these projects have the best impact and deliver maximum impact.
