I refer to my appointment as liquidator of the Company by its sole shareholder on 12 June 2018.

I am now in a position to report on the progress of the liquidation for the period from 12 June 2018 to 11 June 2019. I enclose:

Realisation and distribution of assets

At the commencement of the liquidation and according to the directors' statutory declaration of solvency made on 8 June 2018, the Company had assets of \$249,793 (translated to £186,027 for the purpose of the declaration of solvency), comprising an intercompany receivable of \$242,396 (£180,518), VAT receivable of \$2,228 (£1,659) and a corporation tax refund of \$5,169 (£3,850).

I attach at Appendix 3 an abstract of my receipts and payments for the period to 11 June 2019, indicating that there have been no transactions to date.

HMRC has provided me with confirmation that the Company has no outstanding tax liabilities and clearance to close the liquidation. I am continuing to liaise with the Company's group in relation to the realisation of the Company's assets.

Liquidator's fees and disbursements

It has been agreed that the costs of executing the liquidation are to be met by a third party, to whom I will write, under a separate cover, with my final invoice for acting as liquidator of the Company.

Disbursements have been incurred in relation to statutory advertising and bonding. These will be invoiced to the third party.

Any personal information held by the Company will continue to be processed in accordance with completing the liquidation of the Company and in accordance with meeting our requirements under applicable Data Protection Legislation/law in the United Kingdom.

Appendix 2 - An extract from the Insolvency (England and Wales) Rules 2016 relating to members' rights to request additional information from the liquidator

Rule 18.9

- 1 The following may make a written request to the office-holder for further information about remuneration (other than pre-administration costs in an administration) set out in a progress report under rule 18.4(1)(b), (c) or (d) or a final report or account under rule 18.14
 - a a secured creditor;
 - b an unsecured creditor with the concurrence of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors (including the creditor in question);
 - c members of the company in a members' voluntary winding up with at least 5% of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at general meetings of the company;
 - d any unsecured creditor with the permission of the court; or
 - e any member of the company in a members' voluntary winding up with the permission of the court.
- 2 A request, or application to the court for permission, by such a person or persons must be made or filed with the court (as applicable) within 21 days of receipt of the report or account by the person, or by the last of them in the case of an application by more than one member or creditor.
- 3 The office holder must, within 14 days of receipt of such a request respond to the person or persons who requested the information by-

providing all of the information requested;

providing some of the information requested;

declining to provide the information requested.

- 4 The office-holder may respond by providing only some of the information requested or decline to provide the information if
 - a The time or cost of preparation of the information would be excessive; or
 - b disclosure of the information would be prejudicial to the conduct of the proceedings;
 - c disclosure of the information might reasonably be expected to lead to violence against any person; or
 - d the office-holder is subject to an obligation of confidentiality in relation to the information.
- 5 An office-holder who does not provide all the information or declines to provide the information must inform the person or persons who requested the information of the reasons for so doing.
- 6 A creditor, and a member of the company in a members' voluntary winding up, who need not be the same as the creditor or members who requested the information, may apply to the court within 21 days of

Appendix 4 - An extract from the Insolvency (England and Wales) Rules 2016 relating to members' rights to challenge the liquidator's remuneration or expenses if excessive

Rule 18.34

- 1 This rule applies to an application in an administration, a winding up or a bankruptcy made by a person mentioned in paragraph (2) on the grounds that
 - a the remuneration charged by the office-holder is in all the circumstances excessive;
 - b the basis fixed for the office-holders remuneration under rules 18.16, 18.18, 18.19, 18.20 and 18.21 (as applicable) is inappropriate; or
 - c the expenses incurred by the office-holder are in all the circumstances excessive.
- 2 The following may make such an application for one or more of the orders set out in rule 18.36 or 18.37 as applicable
 - a a secured creditor
 - b an unsecured creditor with either-
 - the concurrence of at least 10% in value of the unsecured creditors (including that creditor), or
 - ii the permission of the court, or
 - c in a members' voluntary winding up
 - i members of the company with at least 10% of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at general meetings of the company, or
 - ii a member of the company with the permission of the court.
- 3 The application by a creditor or member must be made no later than eight weeks after receipt by the applicant of the progress report under rule 18.3 or final report or account under rule 18.14 which first reports the charging of remuneration or the incurring of the expenses in question ("the relevant report").
