## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

#### 1. General information

Oddbox Delivery Limited is a private company limited by share capital and incorporated in England and Wales (registered number 0963897) under the Companies Act. The Company's registered office is Flat 5, 155 Endlesham Road, London, SW12 8JN. The principal place of business is Unit 9, Bunting Close, Mitcham, London, CR4 4ND.

## 2. Accounting policies

#### 2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

## 2.2 Going concern

The Directors have considered the impact of the global Covid-19 pandemic on the ability of the Company to continue trading for the foreseeable future. Due to the nature of the Company's business the pandemic has in fact had a positive effect on the results of the Company, and enabled it to grow in an efficient manner. The review has included considering the impact of the pandemic to the date of signing the financial statements and updating financial projections and performing stress testing on these projections in respect of income, cash flows and the Company's supply chain. Based on this review and taken together with existing financing facilities the Directors believe that the financial statements have been prepared appropriately on the going concern basis.

## 2.3 Turnover

Turnover is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the turnover can be reliably measured. Turnover is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes. The following criteria must also be met before turnover is recognised:

## Sale of goods

Turnover from the sale of goods is recognised when all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- the Company has transferred the significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer;
- the Company retains neither continuing managerial involvement to the degree usually associated with ownership nor effective control over the goods sold;
- the amount of turnover can be measured reliably;
- it is probable that the Company will receive the consideration due under the transaction; and
- the costs incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably.

## 2. Accounting policies (continued)

#### 2.4 Foreign currency translation

#### **Functional and presentation currency**

The Company's functional and presentational currency is GBP.

### Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate.

#### 2.5 Operating leases: the Company as lessee

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 2.6 Pensions

#### Defined contribution pension plan

The Company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. A defined contribution plan is a pension plan under which the Company pays fixed contributions into a separate entity. Once the contributions have been paid the Company has no further payment obligations.

The contributions are recognised as an expense in profit or loss when they fall due. Amounts not paid are shown in accruals as a liability in the Balance sheet. The assets of the plan are held separately from the Company in independently administered funds.

#### 2.7 Current and deferred taxation

The tax expense for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in profit or loss except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the Balance sheet date, except that:

- The recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits; and
- Any deferred tax balances are reversed if and when all conditions for retaining associated tax allowances have been met.

Deferred tax balances are not recognised in respect of permanent differences except in respect of business combinations, when deferred tax is recognised on the differences between the fair values of assets acquired and the future tax deductions available for them and the differences between the fair values of liabilities acquired and the amount that will be assessed for tax. Deferred tax is determined using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

## 2. Accounting policies (continued)

#### 2.8 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

At each reporting date the company assesses whether there is any indication of impairment. If such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is determined which is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and its value in use. An impairment loss is recognised where the carrying amount exceeds the recoverable amount.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Leasehold improvements-50%per annumPlant and machinery-33%per annumOffice equipment-33%per annumComputer equipment-33%per annum

The assets' residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively if appropriate, or if there is an indication of a significant change since the last reporting date.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised in profit or loss.

#### 2.9 Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis.

At each balance sheet date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stock is impaired and cannot be sold it is donated to charity and the cost recognised in profit or loss.

## 2.10 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

## 2.11 Provisions for liabilities

Provisions are made where an event has taken place that gives the Company a legal or constructive obligation that probably requires settlement by a transfer of economic benefit, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Provisions are charged as an expense to profit or loss in the year that the Company becomes aware of the obligation, and are measured at the best estimate at the Balance sheet date of the expenditure required to settle the obligation, taking into account relevant risks and uncertainties.

When payments are eventually made, they are charged to the provision carried in the Balance sheet.

## 2.12 Financial instruments

The Company only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties and loans to related parties.

Short term debtors and creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial instruments, including loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

Financial liabilities and equity are classified according to the substance of the financial instrument's contractual obligations, rather than the financial instrument's legal form.

## 3. Employees

The average monthly number of employees, including directors, during the year was 23 (2019 - 9).

On 16 March 2020 6,202 Ordinary shares were issued for a total consideration of £249,980, 44,658 Ordinary A1 shares were issued for a total consideration of £1,800,000 and 4,962 Ordinary A2 shares were issued for a total consideration of £200,000.

On 18 April 2020 2,732 Ordinary shares were issued for a total consideration of £110,117.

On 29 May 2020 5,262 Ordinary shares were issued for a total consideration of £212,111.

All shares were issued at par value of £0.001 per share and £2,572,144 has been credited to the share premium account.

Costs incurred on issuing shares in the year totalled £144,987 and were deducted from the share premium reserve.

#### 12. Pension commitments

The Company operates a defined contributions pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the Company in an independently administered fund. Contributions totalling £5,582 (2019: £nil) were payable to the fund at the balance sheet date and are included in other creditors.

## Accruals

Purchases of produce have been increased by £22,421 due to goods delivered to the Company in June 2019 not being recognised until after the year end.

#### Stock

Produce with a total value of £3,053 has been recognised as stock on the balance sheet to reflect that fact that it was sold after 30 June 2019.

## Holiday pay accrual

An accrual has been recognised for the cost of annual leave owed to employees as at 30 June 2019 with a value of £4,552.

### Dilapidations provision

A provision of £1,875 has been recognised for the cost of removing the cold store from the warehouse at the end of the lease.

The cumulative effect of the prior year adjustments is a reduction of reserves by £25,795. In addition to the above certain balances have been restated to better reflect their nature:

- Other debtors and other creditors have increased to recognise £70,239 of cash held by a third party on behalf of the Company as at 30 June 2019. This relates to payments taken from customers in advance of deliveries being made.
- A rent deposit with a value of £15,833 has been reclassified from other debtors due within one year to other debtors due in more than one year as the lease expires in over one year.
- Staff costs totalling £17,971 have been reclassified from administrative expenses to cost of sales to reflect the role that these members of staff perform.

## 16. Auditors' information

The auditors' report on the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2020 was unqualified.
