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Strategic report

For the year ended 31 December 2019

The directors present their Annual Report on the affairs of the company, together with the accounts and auditor's report, for the year ended 31 December 2019. The accounts are presented under Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102) issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

Business strategy

The principal activity of the company is to hold and manage an investment in Portugal Renewable Energy – PTRW, Unipessoal Lda (Portugal Renewable Energy).

Financial and operational review

As shown in the profit and loss account the company has made a profit of €20.2m in the year (2018 - €16.4m). The balance sheet shows the company's net asset position at the year end of €327.5m (2018 - €329.2m) consistent with the prior year. The activity of the company is to hold and manage Portugal Renewable Energy. The company's directors believe that further key performance indicators for the company are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business. The performance of Portugal Renewable Energy is discussed within the strategic report in that company's Annual Report and the consolidated financial statements of UK Renewable Holdco 1 Limited which does not form part of this report.

Dividends

The directors do not recommend payment of a final dividend (2018 - €nil). An interim dividend of €21.9m was declared and paid in the year (2018 - €3.0m).

Outlook

The directors expect the company to make a profit in the forthcoming year.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The company is primarily financed by equity, with liquidity risk managed through intergroup assets and liabilities. All intercompany balances are deemed recoverable, with the company regularly monitoring the credit standing of counterparties with whom it has financial exposure. The carrying value of investments held in the balance sheet not being supported by future cash flows from subsidiaries is a risk, however, the directors consider that this risk is mitigated based on current and projected profitability of the company's investments. The interest rate risk is mitigated due to loans being at fixed rates.

Future developments and events after the balance sheet date

The group continues to consider the potential impact of Brexit on its business. Based on the assessment of the latest available information, our principal risk continues to be that there could be a material long term change in the exchange rate, which could reduce the value of future cashflows from foreign investments.

The company continues to actively monitor the situation surrounding the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus. The company's investments are characterised by fully (or highly) regulated operations that deliver an essential service with relatively low likelihood of disruption. The investments operate in an industry where revenue receivables are protected by both regulatory frameworks and high-quality credit profiles of the major counterparties. Whilst there are uncertainties that are caused by COVID-19, at a financial level the company does not have any borrowings or other significant cash obligations that would require any significant cash outflow. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the Annual Report and accounts.

Going concern

The directors have considered the going concern assumption in preparing these financial statements, although there is an operating loss in the year. The directors' assessment has considered the company's forecasts, current financial resources and taking account of reasonably possible sensitivities in light of current economic uncertainty. The company's business activities, performance and position together with its principal risks and uncertainties likely to affect its future development and performance are set out above. The directors have made enquiries and reviewed the forecasts and have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue operations for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the Annual Report and accounts.

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the year and the prior period.

General information and basis of accounting

UK Renewable Holdco 3 Limited (the company) is a company incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Companies Act. The company is a private company limited by shares and is registered in England and Wales. The address of the companies registered office is 3 More London Riverside, London, SE1 2AQ.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value, and in accordance with FRS 102 issued by the Financial Reporting Council. The transitional provisions relating to the triennial review amendments have not resulted in any restatements of comparative information by the Group.

The functional and presentational currency is considered to be Euros because that is the currency of the primary trade in which the company operates.

The company is exempt from the requirement of FRS 102 (Section 7) to present a cash flow statement, certain financial instrument disclosures, and key management personnel disclosures, as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of UK Renewable Holdco 1 Limited, which prepares consolidated accounts which are publicly available. The company is not required to prepare group accounts as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of UK Renewable Holdco 1 Limited which prepares consolidated accounts which are publicly available.

Going concern

The company's business activities, performance and position together with its principal risks and uncertainties likely to affect its future development and performance are set out in the Strategic report.

The directors have made enquiries and reviewed the forecasts and have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the Annual Report and accounts.

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the accounts that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the accounts. A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised

only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Financial instruments

All financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at transaction price (including transaction costs), except for those financial assets classified as at fair value through profit or loss, which are initially measured at fair value (which is normally the transaction price excluding transaction costs), unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction. If an arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, the financial asset or financial liability is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Financial assets and liabilities are only offset in the statement of financial position when, and only when there exists a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and the company intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Reserves

The profit and loss reserve represents cumulative profits or losses, including unrealised profit net of dividends paid and other adjustments.

Foreign Currency

The entity enters into borrowings denominated in foreign currencies and has overseas operations in foreign currencies. No hedges or cross currency swaps are entered in to. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated to the Companies' functional currency at the foreign exchange rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are retranslated to the functional currency at the foreign exchange rate ruling at that date. Non-monetary assets and liabilities that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies that are stated at fair value are retranslated to the functional currency at foreign exchange rates ruling at the dates the fair value was determined. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the profit and loss.

Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The directors do not consider there to be any critical accounting judgements or key sources of estimation uncertainty.

Finance Bill 2016 included provisions to reduce the main rate of corporation tax to 17% from 1 April 2020. However, in the March 2020 Budget it was announced that the cut in the rate to 17% will now not occur and the Corporation Tax Rate will be held at 19%.
