STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 March 2020.

Principal activity and business review

The principal activity of the company is to hold investments in UK companies on behalf of TTK Prestige Limited, a company incorporated in India.

The loss for the year arose due to an impairment charge being reported following an impairment review of the carrying value of the company's investment in its subsidiary, Horwood Homewares Limited. The trigger for the impairment review was the Covid-19 global pandemic.

The directors are satisfied with the results of the company for the period and they are confident of the future prospects of the company.

Principal risks and uncertainties

This report and financial statements contain certain forward looking assumptions and estimates. These assumptions and estimates are made by the directors in good faith, based upon the information available to them at the time of approval of this report. Actual results may differ from those assumed and estimated in this report and financial statements, depending on a number of factors. These factors include the loss or lack of key personnel and overall economic conditions.

TTK British Holdings Limited is a holding company and receives its only income in the form of dividends from Horwood Homewares Limited, a 100% owned subsidiary. As is the case for the majority of businesses, Horwood Homewares Limited has been adversely affected by the impact of Covid-19 during the last few months of the financial year, with the result that there is no dividend payment proposed for the current financial year and the Statement of Comprehensive Income of Horwood Homewares Limited therefore shows a loss. This is attributable to the shareholding in an investment previously made in Horwood Life Limited. Post year-end the decision has been taken to sell the shareholding in Horwood Life and therefore there is an exceptional cost in the financial year relating to the value of Net Assets and the intercompany debtor as at the year-end.

The Balance Sheet also shows significant net current liabilities due to the repayments payable in the coming financial year on a bank loan. TTK Prestige Limited as parent company, has confirmed to the directors that it will continue to support the repayments due on this loan through a Standby Letter of Credit issued previously to the bank. TTK Prestige Limited has also committed to supporting any working capital or cash requirements of TTK British Holdings Limited.

At the current time, the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic represents a risk to Horwood Homewares Limited, and therefore to the income stream for TTK British Holdings Limited, due to the ongoing disruption to both the overall worldwide economy and specifically to trading restrictions within the retail sector which have been in place for periods of the year. Based on the trading performance of Horwood Homewares being much stronger than anticipated in the first three quarters of the financial year to 31 March 2021, the Board remains confident that the company is well placed to overcome the current challenges and will continue to prosper moving forward.

Financial risk management

The company's financial instruments comprise borrowings, cash at bank and various items that arise directly from its operations. The main purpose of these financial instruments is to fund the company's operations.

Results and dividends

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £2,881,500 (2019 - profit £1,003,094). The loss for the year arose due to an impairment charge being reported following an impairment review of the carrying value of the company's investment in its subsidiary, Horwood Homewares Limited. The trigger for the impairment review was the Covid-19 global pandemic.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

1. General information

TTK British Holdings Limited is a private company, limited by shares, incorporated in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Avonmouth Way, Bristol, United Kingdom, BS11 9HX.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' and the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 101 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgment in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 3).

2.2 Financial reporting standard 101 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions under FRS 101:

- the requirement in paragraph 38 of IAS 1 'Presentation of Financial Statements' to present comparative information in respect of:
 - paragraph 79(a)(iv) of IAS 1;

- the requirements in IAS 24 Related Party Disclosures to disclose related party transactions entered into between two or more members of a group, provided that any subsidiary which is a party to the transaction is wholly owned by such a member

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.3 Going concern

The company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development and position, are set out in the Strategic Report on page 2.

The company is a holding company whose principal subsidiary, Horwood Homewares Limited, continues to generate positive cash flows, despite being adversely affected currently by the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. A revised operating budget has been prepared for Horwood Homewares Limited reflecting the current operating environment and this is being monitored closely alongside the cash flow. The performance of Horwood Homewares since April 2020 has continually exceeded expectations and by December Net Sales, Gross Margin and PBIT were all in excess of not only the budget for the year but also the prior year figures.

TTK Prestige Limited as 100% owner of TTK British Holdings Limited has confirmed that it will continue to support TTK British Holdings Limited in terms of repayments of the bank loan and any working capital or cash requirements. This, and the review of the cash flow forecasts for the next 12 months, provide the directors with a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to enable it to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

2.4 Exemption from preparing consolidated financial statements —

The Company is a parent Company that is also a subsidiary included in the consolidated financial statements of its immediate parent undertaking established under the law of a non-EEA state and is therefore exempt from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements under section 401 of the Companies Act 2006.

2.5 Valuation of fixed asset investments

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

Cost of fixed asset investments includes acquisition costs.

2.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.7 Creditors

Creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers.

Creditors are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.8 Foreign currency translation

Functional and presentation currency

The Company's functional and presentational currency is GBP.

Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate. Non-monetary items measured at historical cost are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items measured at fair value are measured using the exchange rate when fair value was determined.

Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of transactions and from the translation at period-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in profit or loss except when deferred in other comprehensive income as qualifying cash flow hedges.

Foreign exchange gains and losses that relate to borrowings and cash and cash equivalents are presented in the Statement of Comprehensive Income within 'finance income or costs'. All other foreign exchange gains and losses are presented in profit or loss within 'other operating income'.

2.9 Finance costs

Finance costs are charged to profit or loss over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

2.10 Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the year in which they are incurred.

3. Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting practice requires management to make estimates and judgements that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities as well as the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the balance sheet date and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period.

Impairment of assets

The company assesses at each reporting date whether an asset may be impaired. If there is any such indication that the carrying value may not be recoverable, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. The recoverable amount of an asset or cash generating unit is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and its value in use. If the recoverable amount is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is impaired and it is reduced to its recoverable amount through an impairment in profit and loss. The directors made this assessment at 31 March 2020 using approved 5 year forecasts of the trading subsidiary, a pre-tax discount rate of 12.9% and terminal growth rate of 2.43%. This resulted in an impairment provision of £2,596,434 which has been recognised in these accounts.
