GOING CONCERN

Notwithstanding net current liabilities, excluding debtors more than one year, of £8,524 as at 31 December 2020, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which the directors consider to be appropriate for the following reasons.

After reviewing the cash flow forecasts for a period of at least 12 months, the directors are satisfied that taking account of reasonably possible downsides, including the potential impact of COVID-19, the Company will have sufficient funds to meet its liabilities as they fall due for that period. For this reason, the directors consider it appropriate to adopt the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements

The directors have considered the impact of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and potential implications on future operations. Whilst there are significant wider market uncertainties which may impact the Company, the directors do not believe this will impact the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern for at least the next 12 months.

Those forecasts are dependent on Top Technology Ventures Limited not seeking repayment of the amounts currently due to the company, which at 31 December 2020 amounted to £8,525. Top Technology Ventures Limited has indicated via a letter of support that it does not intend to seek repayment of these amounts for the period covered by the forecasts. As with any company placing reliance on other group entities for financial support, the directors acknowledge that there can be no certainty that this support will continue although, at the date of approval of these financial statements, they have no reason to believe that it will not do so.

Consequently, the directors are confident that the Company will have sufficient funds to continue to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements and therefore have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

As the Covid-19 virus has developed over recent months, the directors have been assessing the impact on the Company to ensure that such impacts are effectively managed.

Notwithstanding the potential impact of Covid-19, the directors believes that the Company will continue to operate satisfactorily for the foresceable future.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2020

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

IP2IPO Portfolio (GP) Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The Company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

The principal activity of IP2IPO Portfolio (GP) Limited (the "Company") during the year was the management of IP2IPO Portfolio L.P. (the "Partnership"), a limited partnership which funds the formation, building and development of spin-out companies specialising in the commercialisation of scientific innovations developed at leading universities and research institutions in the UK with a view to making a profit. The Company has assigned its parent company, Top Technology Ventures Limited to act as "Operator" and has appointed IP Group plc to advise on and manage the investments of the Partnership.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The Financial Statements of IP2IPO Portfolio (GP) Limited (the "Company") are for the year ended 31 December 2020. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. The policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101").

In these financial statements, the Company has applied the exemptions available under FRS 101 in respect of the following disclosures: a Cash Flow Statement and related notes; disclosures in respect of transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries; disclosures in respect of capital management; the effects of new but not yet effective IFRSs; and disclosures of transactions with a management entity that provides key management personnel services to the Company. The Company has also applied the exemption from the requirements of IFRS 7 Financial Instruments: Disclosures, the equivalent disclosures are included in the IP Group ple consolidated financial statements.

Changes in accounting policies

(i) New standards, interpretations and amendments effective from 1 January 2020

There are no amendments to accounting standards, or IFRIC interpretations that are effective for the year ended 31 December 2020 that have had a material impact on the Company's financial statements.

(ii) New standards, interpretations and amendments not yet effective

No new standards, interpretations and amendments not yet effective are expected to have a material effect on the Group's future financial statements.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax

Provision is made in full for deferred tax liabilities that arise from timing differences where transactions or events, that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, have occurred by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is considered more likely than not that they will be recoverable. Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Related party transactions

In accordance with IAS 24 "Related Parties Disclosures", the Company discloses details of material transactions between the reporting entity and related parties. However, transactions between the Company and other Group companies have not been disclosed in accordance with the exemption in IAS 24 paragraph 16.

3. EMPLOYEES AND DIRECTORS

During the year the Company had no employees (2019: none). The directors were remunerated for their services to other group companies within the group headed by the Company's ultimate parent, IP Group plc. The directors of the Company chose to waive any remuneration during the year ended 31 December 2020, for their services to this entity.
