**1. General Information**

JDH Exploration Ltd is a company limited by shares incorporated in the England. The registered office of the company is 49 Greek Street, London, W1D 4EG, England which is also the principal place of business of the company. The principal activity of the company in the year was the mining of iron ores. The financial statements have been presented in Pound Sterling (£) which is also the functional currency of the company.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

**Statement of compliance**

The financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2022 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2006.

**Basis of preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

**Exploration Costs**

The Company incurs Exploration costs. These costs have been expensed during the year in line with FRS102 Section 24 which, in itself references to IFRS 6 Exploration for and Evaluation of Mineral Resources.

**Intangible assets**

**Patents, trademarks and licences**

Patents, trademarks and licences are valued at cost less accumulated amortisation.

**Property, plant and equipment and depreciation**

Fixed assets value was written off in the period with the following rate used in the prior period.

Plant and machinery	- 15% Reducing balance
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The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

**Leasing**

Rentals payable under operating leases are dealt with in the Income Statement as incurred over the period of the rental agreement.

**Trade and other debtors**

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

**Trade and other creditors**

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

**Employee benefits**

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund.

**Taxation and deferred taxation**

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable profits for the financial year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Statement of Financial Position date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future. Timing differences are temporary differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are anticipated to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Statement of Financial Position date.

No deferred tax asset is recognised as it is uncertain that the company will generate sufficient profits to make use of these losses in the foreseeable future.

**Foreign currencies**

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the Statement of Financial Position date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined. The resulting exchange differences are dealt with in the Income Statement.

**Ordinary share capital**

The ordinary share capital of the company is presented as equity.

**3. Going concern**

The company incurred a loss for the year and reported net liabilities at 31 March 2022. The company is dependent on its parent, Walkabout Resources Ltd, to provide funding as required to meet its financial commitments as they fall due. With continued support from the parent entity, the directors have concluded that this company will have sufficient resources to meet its commitments for a period of at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements.

**4. INFORMATION RELATING TO THE AUDITOR'S REPORT**

The Audit Report was unqualified. The following are the matters to which the auditors were required to refer by way of emphasis

**Emphasis of Matter**

In forming our opinion, which is not qualified, we have considered the adequacy of the disclosures made in note 3 to the financial statements concerning the company's ability to continue as a going concern. The company incurred a loss during the year and at the year end the company's current liabilities exceeded its total assets. These conditions along with other matters explained in note 3 to the financial statements indicate the existence of a material uncertainty that casts significant doubt as to whether the company can continue as a going concern without the support of its parent and the directors. The financial statements do not contain the adjustments that would result if the company was unable to continue as a going concern.

The financial statements were audited by HCA Chartered Accountants Ltd.
