## 1 Accounting policies

## Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

## Going concern

The company had net assets of £403 at the period end. Included in creditors is £32,000 due to the parent company, Romsons Scientific and Surgical Industries Private Limited. The parent company has agreed not to call in its loan and to provide continued financial support for a period of at least one year from the date of approval of these financial statements.

On the basis of the parent company support the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

### Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes in the normal course of business.

### **Debtors**

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price), less any impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts: Loans and other financial assets are initially recognised at transaction price including any transaction costs and subsequently measured at amortised cost determined using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

## Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price). Loans and other financial liabilities are initially recognised at transaction price net of any transaction costs and subsequently measured at amortised cost determined using the effective interest method.

## **Taxation**

A current tax liability is recognised for the tax payable on the taxable profit of the current and past periods. A current tax asset is recognised in respect of a tax loss that can be carried back to recover tax paid in a previous period. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences between the recognition of income and expenses in the financial statements and their inclusion in tax assessments. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference, except for revalued land and investment property where the tax rate that applies to the sale of the asset is used. Current and deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

## **Provisions**

Provisions (ie liabilities of uncertain timing or amount) are recognised when there is an obligation at the reporting date as a result of a past event, it is probable that economic benefit will be transferred to settle the obligation and the amount of the obligation can be estimated reliably.

## Foreign currency translation

Transactions in foreign currencies are initially recognised at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. At the end of each reporting period foreign currency monetary items are translated at the closing rate of exchange. Non-monetary items that are measured at historical cost are translated at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are charged to profit or loss.

## 6 Related party transactions

During the period the company charged commission to Romsons International, an entity under common control, of £39,049 (2019: £46,116). At the period end, there was a balance due from Romsons International of £28,614 (2019: £9,635) in respect of commission charged.

During the period the company charged commission to Romsons Juniors India, an entity under common control, of £ 1,301 (2019: £6,416). At the period end, there was a balance due from Romsons International of £ 1,333 (2019: £1,365) in respect of commission charged.

During the period the company charged commission to Romsons Scientific and Surgical Industries Private Limited, the parent company, of £3,173 (2019: £3,369). At the period end, there was a balance due from Romsons International of £1,929 (2019: £1,922) in respect of commission charged.

Included in creditors at the period end was an unsecured loan due to Romsons Scientific and Surgical Industries Private Limited of £32,000 (2019: £72,000). There are no terms as to interest or repayment in regards to this amount.
