

The company's stakeholders are the reside; is and housing co-operatives for whom we have produced our design work. Our design proposals are a result of extensive consulations with residents, visits and tours around their estates and homes, as well as presentations and exhibitions of designs at which residents comment upon our proposals.

For our work with the Brixton Gardens co-operative housing development we worked with the Brixton Housing Co-operative. the Sanford Housing Co-operative, Westminster Housing Co-operative. Co-ops for London, and representatives from the London Mayor's Small Sites & Small Builders programme, to explore the options for the site, develop a co-operative Community Land Trust model, and to collectively formulate the proposal for the best possible social, economic and environmental outcomes.

For our work with Montreal Square we have advised residents on the consequences of demolition for them. communicating with Cambridge council, raising objections to their proposals, drafting letters, and exploring design alternatives to demolition.

For our month's residency at 221A gallery in Vancouver, we consulted with local community engagement officers, architects. urban development scholars, credit unions, community land trusts, activists and housing campaigners on the similarities and differences between the economic causes and policy solutions to the housing crises in Canada and the UK.
