## THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

The directors of Marshall ADG Ltd (the "Company") present their Report and Financial Statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2022. In preparing this report, the directors have taken advantage of the small companies exemptions provided by Section 415A of the Companies Act 2006.

#### **RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS**

The company did not trade during the year. The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2021: £nil).

#### **PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The company was an investment holding company during the year. The directors expect the company to continue with this activity for the foreseeable future.

None of the directors holding office at 31 December 2022 had notified a beneficial interest in any contract to which the company or other group undertakings were a party during the financial year.

In addition to considering the company's forecast cash flows for the foreseeable future, the directors have also made enquiries of the MCH directors, given its potential participation in group banking arrangements. The MCH directors have prepared a formal group going concern assessment, including the impact of certain reasonably possible adverse scenarios, which concludes the group is forecast to be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due for the relevant going concern period.

## 1. Accounting Policies

#### (a) Statement of Compliance

Marshall ADG Ltd is a private company limited by shares incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Airport House, The Airport, Cambridge, CB5 8RY.

The company's financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102") as it applies to the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2022.

#### (b) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the company were authorised for issue on 21 September 2023 by the Board of Directors. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the company.

#### (c) Going Concern

The company could participate in the group treasury arrangements of Marshall of Cambridge (Holdings) Limited (MCH), the Company's immediate and ultimate parent undertaking. Under this arrangement, it would have access to and share banking arrangements and facilities with MCH and fellow group undertakings.

The directors have considered whether the company is able to meet its liabilities as they fall due and is a going concern. In addition to considering the company's forecast cash flows for the foreseeable future, the directors have also made enquiries of the MCH directors, given its potential participation in group banking arrangements. MCH directors have prepared a formal group going concern assessment, including the impact of certain reasonably possible adverse scenarios, which concludes the group is forecast to be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due for the relevant going concern period.

On this basis, the directors of the company have concluded that no material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt about the ability of MCH group to continue as going concern for at least 12 months from the approval of these financial statements.

## (d) Consolidation

In accordance with section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 consolidated financial statements have not been prepared as the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Marshall of Cambridge (Holdings) Limited, the ultimate parent company of the group, which is registered in England and Wales, for which consolidated financial statements are publicly available. These financial statements therefore present information about the company alone and not about its group.

## (e) Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

#### (f) Exemptions For Qualifying Entities Under FRS 102

FRS 102 allows a qualifying entity certain disclosure exemptions, subject to certain conditions, which have been complied with, including notification of, and no objection to, the use of exemptions by the company's shareholders.

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions under FRS 102 reduced disclosure framework:

- (b) The requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows and Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d);
- (c) The requirements of Section 11, paragraphs 11.39 to 11.48A and Section 12, paragraphs 12.26 to 12.29A;
- (d) The requirements of Section 26 Share-based Payment paragraphs 26.18(b), 26.19 to 26.21 and 26.23; and
- (e) The requirements of Section 33 Related Party Disclosures paragraph 33.7.

#### (g) Judgements and Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year.

As the company is a holding company, the directors have determined that there are no significant judgements that require disclosure in the financial statements. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from the estimates.

The following is the company's key source of estimation uncertainty:

#### Impairment of investments

Where there are indicators of impairment of investments, the company compares the carrying value of the asset with its recoverable amount, represented by the higher of its value in use and net realisable value. Value in use is based on a discounted cash flow model, and is therefore sensitive to the discount rate used as well as the expected future cash flows and extrapolated growth rate. Net realisable value is estimated as fair value less costs to sell, based on available data from sales transactions for similar assets.

#### (h) Profit and Loss Account

The Company received no income and incurred no expenditure and therefore made neither profit nor loss.

#### 2. Directors' Emoluments

No emoluments were payable to the directors for their qualifying services to the company during either the current or preceding years.

The directors do not believe that it is practicable to apportion the total remuneration between their qualifying services as directors of the Company and their qualifying services as directors of either the ultimate parent undertaking or fellow subsidiary undertakings. The total remuneration of D. J. Baxter, K. H. Jenkins and S.V. Cummins is disclosed within the financial statements of the immediate parent undertaking.
