261 Fearless Club UK CIC uses running as the vehicle to unite and empower women in the UK and help them to lead active, healthy and fulfilled lives. The company launched as a CIC in October 2017 and during the financial year 2017 to 2018 has benefitted the community in the following ways:

- The establishment of four new running clubs (Burwell-Cambridge 24/11/17, Inverurie-Aberdeen 24/01/18, Bicester 26/04/18, Lancaster 28/9/18) making a total of seven clubs for 261 Fearless Club UK. There have been over 40 new members during this period
- Four women have trained as 261 Fearless coaches to enable them to lead the running sessions. They have increased their knowledge, skills and confidence and the company has supported them in their volunteer role and the establishment of their local clubs. The company now supports a total of 11 coaches with practical, administrative, theoretical and emotional matters, to ensure they are able to lead their clubs effectively
- All clubs have provided social, non-competitive running for women in their local area
 for one hour a week with a particular focus on inactive women. The health benefits
 from moving from inactivity to activity are known to be huge and clubs have taken
 steps to target inactive women who are often intimidated and uncertain about attending
 more traditional, competitive exercise classes and running clubs
- Clubs have provided low cost physical activity with club sessions costing £2 per week.
 This is to try to remove finance as a barrier to activity. The company also acquired funding for three women on low income to participate in the coach training education
- All clubs have led intermittent 'family sessions' where members' children are invited to attend to encourage active families and healthy role modelling
- Education is key to empowerment. Coaches have passed on their knowledge of healthy running to members and clubs have also run separate educational events such as 'breast care evenings' where a local women's health specialist gave a presentation about the importance of breast care and members were correctly fitted for sports bras
- The clubs themselves have become communities within which women are able to form friendships, inspiration and motivation to aid them in their quest for good physical and mental health. They have extended these connections outside of the running club hour and many have become involved in other community events, including fundraising which further strengthens local bonds and improves wellbeing.

The stakeholders are the coaches that lead the running club sessions and the members of those clubs who come from the communities surrounding each club.

Through 2017/2018 we ran monthly group Skype calls with the coaches so they were always up to date with events. They were invited to send questions and feedback before the calls to add to the agenda and the calls also included a chance for coaches to express opinions and make suggestions. The company responded to suggestions regarding streamlining administrative processes such as registering new members, requests for marketing tools and purchasing merchandise to make members feel part of a community. We held a face to face refresher event for all coaches in December 2017 which provided a further opportunity for feedback and as a result of the positive feedback we will continue with annual coach refreshers and ongoing monthly online meetings.

All clubs are asked to hold a meeting for their members after they have been operational for one year and then at least annually after that. Getting feedback from members is a crucial part of that meeting. For example, the Greenwich club held their annual meeting in October 2017 and used a problem solving exercise technique to make sure that all the members were able to give their views. Lots of ideas were generated to help the club grow and attract new members such as an advert in a local paper and considering allocating specific women to welcome and 'buddy up with' new members.
